

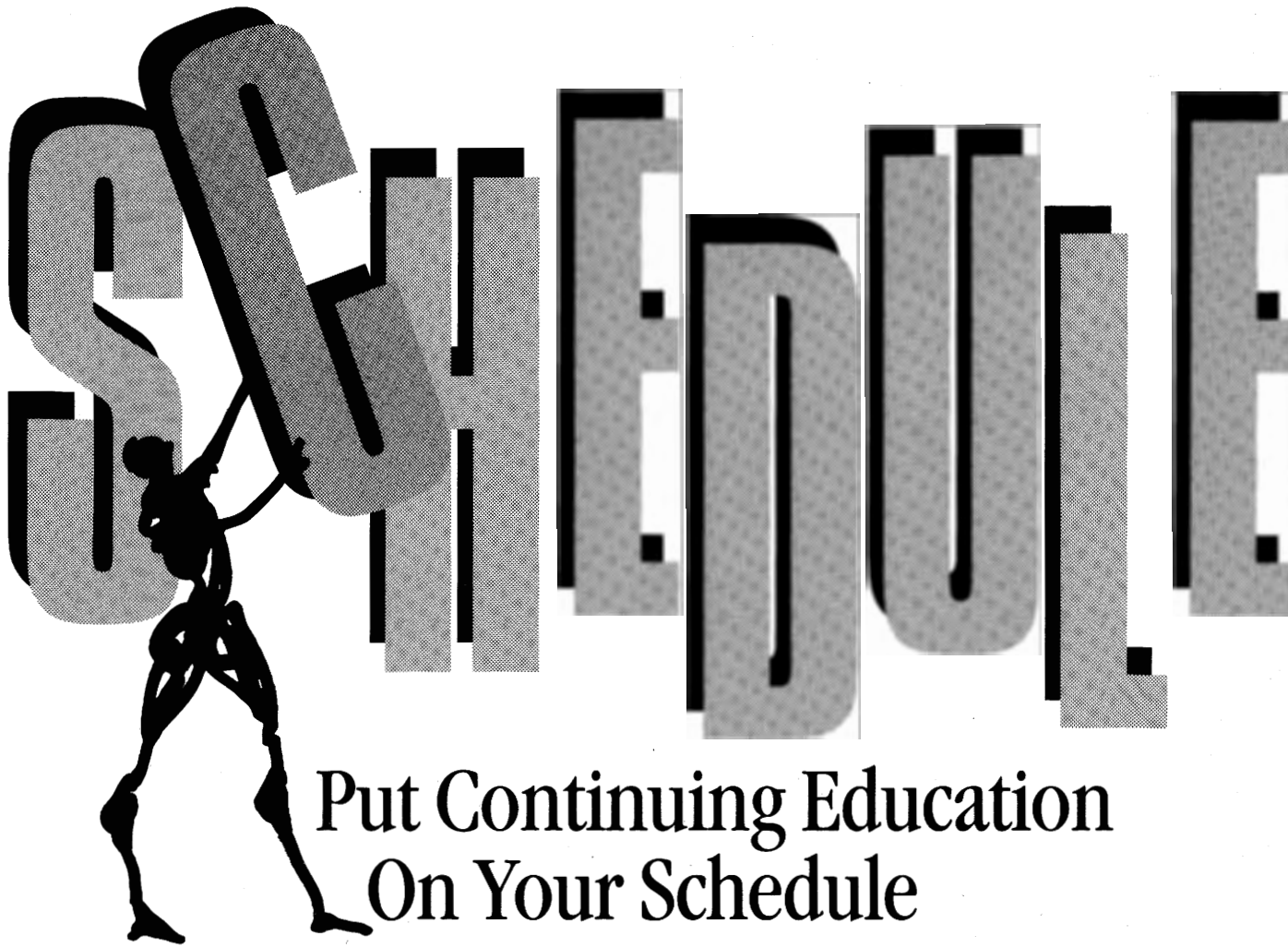

WELCOME



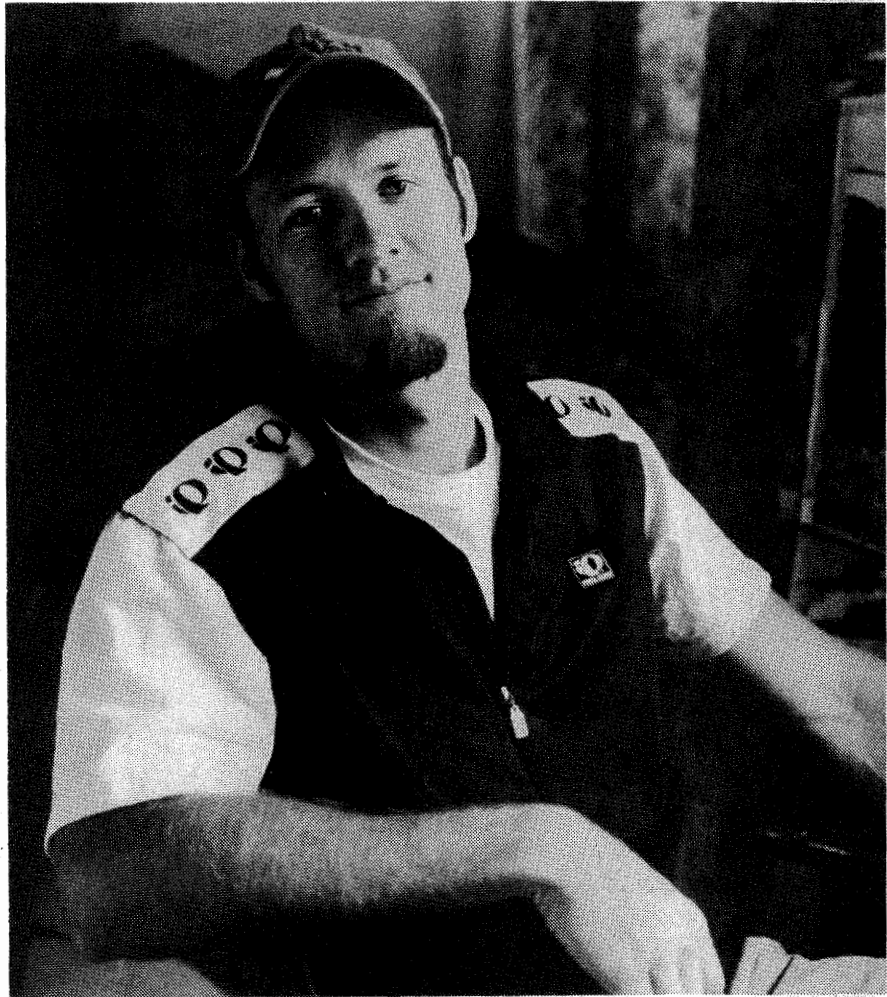
STUDENT ART CONTEST

**NOVEMBER 7 (MON.) -
DECEMBER 6 (TUES.)**

- Spring 1995 confirmed-registration time assignments for students enrolled during fall 1994. Continuing students can continue registering for the spring semester through January 6; however, for best course selections, register as close to your time assignment as possible.

**DECEMBER 7 (WED.) -
JANUARY 6 (FRI.)**

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed registration.
- Spring 1995 registration for new and readmitted students who are not required to attend an orientation.

DECEMBER 16 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your permanent address to ensure that your spring 1995 schedule/bill and ID validation sticker are mailed to the correct address.

DECEMBER 22 (THURS.)

- **Deadline** to register and receive a schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. Students who register after this date can pick up their schedule/bill and ID validation sticker at the Coors Events/Conference Center, **January 9-12.** (See page 22.)

DECEMBER 30 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** (for continuing students only) to withdraw from the University and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges, by 4:00 p.m. New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See page 33.)

JANUARY 6 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for all students (undergraduate and graduate) to register for spring courses. **Registration must be completed by 10:00 p.m. to be**

guaranteed enrollment for spring semester. After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and late fees are charged. (See page 32 for late registration information.)

JANUARY 9 (MON.)

- Schedule/bill distribution for those students who registered *after* December 22, for students who need a revised schedule/bill, or for students who did not receive a schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., through Thursday, January 12, at the Coors Events/Conference Center. **Exception:** Additional hours on Tuesday, January 10, until 7:00 p.m. (See page 22.)
- Schedule adjustment begins for those students with a January 9 time assignment. (See page 23.)

JANUARY 10 (TUES.)

- Schedule-adjustment time assignments continue. (See page 23.)
- Registration begins for faculty and staff.

JANUARY 11 (WED.)

- Classes begin.
- Schedule adjustment continues for all students.

JANUARY 12 (THURS.)

- Last day for schedule/bill and ID validation sticker distribution, schedule adjustment, and late registration screening at the Coors Events/Conference Center. Beginning Friday, January 13, these registration services are located in the basement of Regent, room 1B60, through Friday, January 27.

JANUARY 12 - 13 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Space-available (SAVE) registration at the Coors Events/Conference Center from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (See page 33.)

JANUARY 16 (MON.)

- Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. No classes.

JANUARY 17 - 18 (TUES. - WED)

- Space-available registration for senior auditors, Koenig Alumni Center, Tuesday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Wednesday, 9:00 a.m. to noon.

JANUARY 17 (TUES.)

- The Office of the Registrar and Bursar's Office in Regent Administrative Center are open from **8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.** for schedule adjustment, schedule/bill distribution, ID validation, billing questions, tuition payment, refund-check distribution, deferred tuition, and short-term loans.

JANUARY 20 (FRI.)

The following transactions must be completed by 4:00 p.m.:

- **Deadline** to pay full tuition and fees and to turn in a deferred tuition agreement. **No grace period.**
- **Deadline** to waive University-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Student Health Center. (See page 28.)

JANUARY 24 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** (midnight) to add your name to a course wait list. (See page 21.)

JANUARY 27 (FRI.)

The following transactions must be completed by 4:00 p.m.:

- **Deadline** to add a course, including independent study and thesis. This deadline is in effect unless enrollment levels are reached earlier.
- **Deadline** to drop a course without being assessed tuition and fees for that course and without a *W* showing on your transcript. After this date, you

must be passing your course to receive approval to drop it, and you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form.

- **Deadline** to change course credit options.
- **Deadline** to withdraw from the University and be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See page 33.)

FEBRUARY 10 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to withdraw from the University and be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees.

FEBRUARY 17 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 6 for more information.)

- **Deadline** for transfer credit to be added and for corrections to CU credit hours to be made to your record on the Student Information System (SIS) in order to affect summer and fall 1995 registration time assignments.

FEBRUARY 21 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** to drop a course, without petitioning your dean, by 4:00 p.m.

FEBRUARY 24 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to withdraw from the University and be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees. **After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due.**

- **Deadline** to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition, by 4:00 p.m. **No grace period.**

- **Deadline** to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office. (See page 17.)

MARCH 13 - 17 (MON. - FRI.)

- Distribution of the *Summer Session 1995 Catalog* and the *Fall 1995 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* in Regent foyer, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., (except Monday, March 13, until 6:00 p.m.) and UMC 422, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Beginning Monday, March 20, distribution is in Regent 105.

MARCH 15 (WED.) - JUNE 2 (FRI.)

- Summer 1995 confirmed registration for continuing degree students enrolled during spring 1995.

MARCH 27 - 31 (MON. - FRI.)

- Spring break. No classes.

MARCH 31 (FRI.)

- University holiday; University closed.

APRIL 3 (MON.) - APRIL 28 (FRI.)

- Fall 1995 confirmed registration for continuing degree students enrolled during spring 1995.

MAY 1 (MON.)

- Last day of classes for spring 1995.
- Fall 1995 confirmed registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.
- Summer 1995 confirmed registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.

MAY 2 - 3 (TUES. - WED.)

- Reading days.

MAY 4 - 10 (THURS. - WED.)

- Final exams for spring 1995. (There are no exams on Sunday, May 7.)

MAY 12 (FRI.)

- Spring 1995 commencement at Folsom Stadium, 9:30 a.m.

AUGUST 25 (FRI.)

- Fall 1995 schedule/bill and ID validation sticker distribution for new freshmen and transfer students and for those students who did not receive their schedule/bill and/or ID validation sticker in the mail.

- Final schedule-adjustment (drop/add) begins for new freshmen and undergraduate transfer students *only*.

AUGUST 27 (SUN.)

- Final schedule-adjustment (drop/add) begins for all other students (*via CU Connect only*).

SPRING 1995 FINAL EXAMINATIONS

The following final examination schedules list all final exams by meeting pattern, exam time, and common exams.

If you have three or more final exams scheduled on the same day, you are entitled to arrange an alternative exam time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. To qualify for rescheduling final exam times, you must provide evidence that you have three or more exams on the same day, and arrangements must be made with your instructor no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (Friday, February 17).

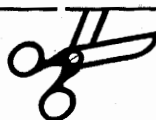

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Before you register, read the following information. Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered here. The information is listed by subject or topic and is in alphabetical order.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822.

Addresses—Very Important!

- *Keep your addresses updated at all times.*

Three addresses on your student record must be kept current: your mailing address, permanent address, and summer address.

Your **mailing address** is your address during the school year, *e.g.*, the residence hall, apartment, or house where you live during the fall and spring semesters. Your invitation to register, outstanding tuition and fee

bills, refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May. (**Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.)

Your **permanent address** is considered your "home-base" address. It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills and ID validation stickers are mailed to this address before the semester begins. In addition, grades and financial-aid notifications are mailed here. This address is used during the summer months (mid-May through late August), unless you indicate a summer address (see below) and during the winter semester break.

Your **summer address** is your address during the summer months (mid-May through late August). **Exception:** Grades are always mailed to your permanent address. If you don't indicate a summer address, your permanent address is used during the summer months.

Note that you can have a number of address combinations: a different address for mailing, permanent, and summer, or the same address for any two or all three of these categories.

You can look up any of your addresses on CUline and, when needed, fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105 or in the Financial Aid Office, Environmental Design, room 2, or call (303) 492-6581 to update them. Note that these addresses are for the registrar's office only. Other offices, such as the library, Housing, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems, and changes must be made there as well.

- *Check your invitation to register for advising requirements!*
- *See pages 34-35 for locations and phone numbers of advisors on campus.*

If you are required by your college or school to consult with an advisor before registering for courses, you are notified

on your invitation to register (see page 19) or when you call CU Connect. If you receive such a message and you are an arts and sciences or engineering student, call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office to make arrangements for advising (see pages 34-35 for phone numbers). If you are a student in any other college or school and you receive an advising message, call your dean's office.

After you have been advised and the restriction is removed by your advising department, you may call CU Connect to register.

The Office of Undergraduate Academic Affairs (Willard 226; 492-4433) can help with general advising issues. Within this office, the Advising Resource Center (492-8811) has advisors to help "open option" students or students who are thinking of changing their major. Peer advisors are also available to help students with both academic and personal concerns. In addition, some colleges hold workshops for students on general education requirements (core curriculum and college list).

Changing Your Major

- *Request this change at your new department.*

If you want to change or declare a major before you register, go to the new major department and ask about the required procedures. If your change of major involves moving into another college or school, an intrauniversity transfer (IUT) must be done. (See page 15.)

Note: If you are or will be working on two majors (same degree), receiving financial aid, and don't plan to graduate from both majors at the same time, your financial aid may be in jeopardy. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the basement of Environmental Design, or call (303) 492-5091.

Class Standing

Undergraduate class standing is based on the total number of semester hours passed, as follows:

Controlled Enrollment and Independent Study Courses

- *You must receive permission from the department to register for these courses.*

If you want to take a course with a 740-799, 800-, or 900-level section number, you must contact the department for the five-digit course call number before you register. Enrollment in these courses is limited by each department. The department staff either enrolls you in the course directly on the computer, gives you a special action form to take to the registrar's office, or gives you the five-digit course call number so you can register for the course via CU Connect.

Course Reservation Program

The Course Reservation Program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the Course Reservation Program.

You are eligible to participate in the Course Reservation Program for fall 1995 if your name is on a wait list for a course as of 10:00 p.m., January 6, 1995, or if you add your name to a wait list after the beginning of the semester and you remain on it through 4:00 p.m., January 27. (All restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering.)

If you are eligible for the program, you will receive a letter in February inviting you to register for the course between March 20-30. You will register for all other fall courses during your regular registration time-assignment.

Credit-Hour Limits

During the registration period, undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), including wait-listed courses.

During the final schedule-adjustment period, undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, including wait-listed courses.

Once you complete registration, check with your college or school to determine the maximum number of credit hours that can be counted toward your degree each semester. Remember that 12 credit hours is considered a full-time undergraduate student load for financial-aid purposes.

Credit Options

- You can select or change credit options throughout the registration and schedule-adjustment periods through 4:00 p.m. on January 27.

- Courses taken for no credit or pass/fail cannot apply towards a graduate degree.
- When you register by telephone for a course and select a credit option (see page 113 for instructions), CU Connect verifies the grading option chosen.

No Credit. To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option. (Press *1 after the course call number, then #.) You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course. You do not receive a grade for a no-credit course. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used.

Pass/Fail. Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option. (Press *2 after the course call number, then #.)

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is not noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should

your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

Note: To change the status of a course from or to *P/F* or *NC*, make the change at the registrar's office in Regent 105 (through January 6), at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12) or in Regent 1B60 (January 13-27). By filling out a credit option form at either location, you do not jeopardize your enrollment in the course. If you attempt to make this change by telephone, you will not be able to reenroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course.

You can select or change credit options throughout the registration and schedule-adjustment periods through 4:00 p.m. on January 27.

Variable Credit. All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (courses with a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you call CU Connect to register, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed throughout registration and schedule adjustment until 4:00 p.m., Friday, January 27.

CUline

CUline, the campus electronic information system, provides important information regarding registration, a listing of available courses, the final exam schedule, tuition, and more.

More than 50 CUline terminals are located in buildings and residence halls throughout the campus. Computing labs in Business, Economics, Education, Engineering, Ketchum, Macky,

LOOKING FOR AVAILABLE COURSES ON CULINE

At any time during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods, you can determine which courses are available by accessing CULine from a dedicated CULine computer terminal at the locations listed above. CULine lists courses that are open, and entries are updated regularly.

From the main CULine menu, move the cursor down with the arrow key and choose **STUDENT ADMIN INFO**; then, press **RETURN**.

At this menu, select **COURSE AVAILABILITY** and press **RETURN**.

Available courses offered for spring, all available arts and sciences core courses, or all available courses in order of time offered may be displayed.

CULine-PLUS: Accessing Your Records On-Line

You can access the following information on CULine-PLUS (Personal Look Up Service) from any CULine computer by using your University student number and Personal Identification Number (PIN):

- *grades for the two most recent terms*
- *degree program information (primary and secondary college, major, and class standing)*
- *registration status (advising requirements and registration time-assignment)*
- *class schedule for the current term, the two most recent terms, and all future terms for which you have registered*
- *current semester billing and financial aid information*
- *current addresses*

You have access only to your own records.

Federal privacy laws and University policies guarantee your right to access your own data and protect this data from unauthorized access by others. Unauthorized access can result in student conduct disciplinary actions and/or civil and criminal proceedings. The University will provide reasonable physical and electronic security for this data, but it is up to you not to compromise the security of this information. If you feel that your PIN is not secure, please contact the registrar's office in Regent 105, and another PIN will be assigned to you.

Degree Audits on CULine-PLUS

Degree audits for majors in journalism, architecture and planning, and business are currently available on CULine-PLUS. Arts and sciences core audits are available for those students who started attending CU-Boulder in spring 1993 or thereafter.

Directory Information

- *Go to the registrar's office by January 27 to have directory information about you withheld.*

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of your education records. However, certain information is considered public or "directory" information. Such information may be released to anyone, unless you inform the Office of the Registrar otherwise.

Directory information is your name, address, phone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in University activities or sports, dates of attendance at the University, enrollment status (full-time or part-time), degrees and awards received, educational institutions attended, and, if you are an athlete, your weight and height.

To prevent release of your directory information, go to the Office of the Registrar by **January 27** to request that

it be withheld. Once requested, nondisclosure of directory information continues until you are no longer enrolled at the University or until you request removal of the privacy status. This prevents information from being released to anyone (including you) over the telephone. However, you can still access your grades and other information available to you via CU Connect and Culine.

A complete summary of University policy on the release of student information is available in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*, *Ralphie's Guide to Student Life*, and at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105. For further information, call (303) 492-6907 and ask for the records supervisor.

Double-Degree Programs

• *If you are working in a double-degree program (for example, obtaining one degree from arts and sciences and one from business), verify that the registrar's office has this information.*

Check to see that both degree programs

are on your invitation to register. If both colleges are not on the invitation, you may not be able to register for required courses in both colleges. If you have questions concerning your double-degree program, check with your dean's offices.

Grades Via CU Connect

You can access any semester's grades since summer 1988 by telephone. Call CU Connect at (303) 938-8110 during regular hours of operation.

Enter the following information when prompted:

- *the "grade" action code (5003#)*
- *the term code, followed by #*

(The term code is determined as follows:

GRADUATION RATES

Of freshmen who entered the University in summer or fall 1988 and were enrolled full time in fall 1988, 33 percent graduated within four years, 60 percent graduated within five years, and 66 percent graduated within six years. Graduation rates for the entering classes in 1989 and 1990 are similar.

Help Line

If you have problems or questions concerning telephone registration, call the registration help line at (303) 492-1033. This number has prerecorded registration information available 24 hours a day. To speak with a registration staff member, call between 9:00 a.m. and noon or 1:00 p.m. and 4:00

p.m. MST, Monday through Friday, during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods.

Intrauniversity Transfer (IUT)

- Check with the dean's office of your desired college or school for admission.

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with that dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. Policies vary among the different colleges and schools.

If you have already submitted an IUT application, register as if you have been accepted into the new program. If you are not able to register for some courses because you have not yet been accepted, you may change your schedule during the final schedule-adjustment period.

Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration—New Updates

- If you need to park on campus, whether a car or a bike, you need a permit.

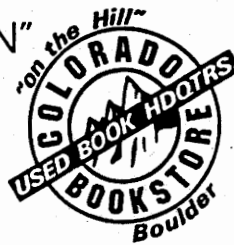

Special Services Form

The special services form allows you to choose special services such as the yearbook, tickets for the Artist Series, and Career Services programs. You do not have to choose any of the services, but completion of the form is a required part of the registration process.

If you are a continuing student, you must fill out the special services form and turn it in to the registrar's office before you can pick up a copy of the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* and register. The special services form is available during the handbook distribution period.

If you are a new or readmitted student, you receive the special services form in the mail or at orientation (for those students required to attend orientation) as part of your registration materials.

If you have not yet completed the form, follow the instructions for filling it out, sign your name, and mail it via U.S. mail or campus mail to the address indicated on the form. You may also drop it off at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105.

Stops on Your Registration

- *Check your invitation to register for stops!*

When you call CU Connect, you may get a message that you have a "stop" on your record. Stops are holds that the University puts on student records for various reasons. They originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. You are not allowed to register until you have cleared all your stops. Most often, a message is printed on your invitation to register indicating a stop. (See page 18 for a sample invitation.) However, stops can occur

at any time in the registration process, so you should always know the status of your student record.

If you have a financial stop, which indicates unpaid University debts, you may be withdrawn from all future terms if you fail to pay your bills. Check with the Bursar's Office in Regent 150, (303) 492-5381.

Time Out Program

For those of you who would like to take a planned leave from CU-Boulder for a semester or a year, the Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity to leave the University without losing your place in your college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the University is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$31 application fee is charged. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, (303) 492-8673.

Note: If you are registered for the semester you plan to begin TOP, you must formally withdraw. See the withdrawal procedures and the "Withdrawal Dates/Refund or Assessment Schedule" on page 33.

Transcripts

- *Order transcripts by phone, mail, or in person in the Office of the Registrar.*

An **internal transcript**, which includes courses, credits, grades, transfer courses accepted, and grade point average (GPA), is mailed to your permanent address approximately two weeks after the end of the semester.

Your **unofficial transcript** is a copy of your CU academic record that is used for advising purposes. You may call 492-6907 or fill out a form in the lobby of

Regent to request that an unofficial transcript be sent to any department on campus at no charge. A personal copy can also be ordered and is available the next working day at the unofficial transcript/enrollment verification window in the foyer of Regent. The cost is \$1 per copy for unofficial transcripts not sent to departments. Same-day processing is available for an additional fee.

Your **official transcript** is the complete record of all courses you have taken at the University of Colorado, both at the undergraduate and graduate level. It contains the signature of the Registrar and the official seal of the University. Official transcripts are primarily used to support applications for transfer to other academic institutions and for employment purposes.

Official transcripts that include end-of-term grades are available approximately 10 days after final examinations; degrees are recorded approximately six weeks after graduation.

There is no charge for official transcripts, which are prepared only at a student's request. Typically, official transcripts require a minimum of four working days to process. However, a rush-transcript service is available for a processing fee. Official transcripts may be ordered by telephone at (303) 492-8987 or by mail. Address your requests to: Office of the Registrar, Transcript Section, CU-Boulder, Campus Box 68, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

All students participate in confirmed registration for spring 1995. You can call CU Connect to register for courses, list your schedule, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register via CU Connect, you receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822.

1 Receiving Your Invitation to Register

- *Your invitation to register is mailed to your mailing address (if you are not required to attend an orientation) and includes your registration time-assignment, personal identification number (PIN), your addresses, and any stops on your registration.*

Your personalized invitation to register (see the opposite page for a sample invitation) that is either mailed to you or given to you at a required orientation indicates the date and time you can call CU Connect to register for courses.

You can call any time after your time assignment begins, through 10:00 p.m. on January 6. However, confirmed registration is conducted on a first-come, first-served basis, and it's to your advantage to call as soon as possible after your registration time-assignment begins. Classes fill up quickly throughout the registration period. **Note:** You must clear all stops before registering.

FINDING YOUR PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (PIN)

Your invitation to register includes your PIN, which allows you access to CU Connect, Culine-PLUS, and the financial aid telephone system. Your

PIN is a randomly set number, must be kept confidential, and remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.

Certain data specific to you is available on these systems. Your PIN controls access to this information. If you feel that your PIN is not secure or you wish to change it, contact the registrar's office in Regent 105.

2 Your Registration Time-Assignment

Registration time-assignments are based on class standing, including the number of hours you have completed at CU (any campus), any transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of September 30). Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, the time assignments are random. Any changes made after September 30 (courses dropped, added, or additional transfer credit) do not change your time assignment.

3 Filling Out Your Confirmed-Registration Form

- *The confirmed -registration form is located on page 114.*

Use the schedule-planning worksheet on page 112 to fill out a preliminary schedule for spring 1995. Then, fill out the confirmed-registration form before calling CU Connect. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your confirmed-registration form in case courses you request are full.

4 Getting Academic Advising

If you are required to see an academic advisor (indicated on your invitation to register), call or visit your major department as soon as possible. You are not allowed to register until you have met with your advisor. Bring your completed confirmed-registration form to your appointment. (See page 10 for more information on advising.)

5 Calling CU Connect and Registering

Call CU Connect, (303) 938-8110, from any touch-tone phone to register. Use the function codes listed on the confirmed-registration form, as well as on page 113. You may call any time after your time assignment begins. Follow the instructions on the confirmed-registration form.

CU Connect is available **Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. to midnight.** It is also available on **Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight.**

CU Connect is *not* available on November 24 and December 25, 1994, and January 1 and January 8, 1995. CU Connect is *only* available through 10:00 p.m. on January 6.

6 Adjusting Your Schedule

- *The registration deadline is 10:00 p.m. on January 6.*
- *Make your changes before you return for classes in the spring!*

Once you have registered, you can make adjustments to your schedule by calling CU Connect through the registration deadline (January 6). Simply follow the CU Connect function codes described

and illustrated on the confirmed-registration form (page 114) to add or drop courses from your schedule. After January 6, see pages 23 and 24 for instructions on making final schedule-adjustments.

SEARCHING FOR OPEN COURSE SECTIONS

If you request a course section that has been canceled or is full, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a search for open sections of that course. If you do, press 7#. CU Connect will search for another section of the course that is available during the same time period. If one is available, you can register for that section. If one is not available, CU Connect will search for the first section of the course that is open and fits your schedule, until it is determined that no section of that course is currently open and available.

COURSE TIME CHANGES

- *Original course sections may be canceled and a new section added.*

Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered after the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. If this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change.

If you register for a course and CU Connect tells you the course has been canceled, try the search option (7#). CU Connect lets you know if the new section of the course with the time change is available and fits your schedule.

Listing Your Schedule

To list your schedule, call CU Connect and press 5# once you are in the system. If you put your name on a course wait list, list your schedule frequently or look up the status of your wait-listed courses on CUline-PLUS before January 27 to find out if you have been enrolled in the class.

WAIT LISTS

Throughout the confirmed-registration and schedule-adjustment periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it has been closed, you may put your name on a computerized wait-list. The course may have openings later in the registration process. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used.

Automatic wait-lists are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.

Resequenced wait-lists use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. Press 9# when prompted and listen for verification.

Wait-Listed Courses

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course. Enrollment is determined by the total number of spaces and the demand for each particular course. Spaces may or may not become available at a future time.

It helps to have a list of alternate course choices if you are not enrolled in a course from the wait list. You may go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, to the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12), to Regent 1B60 (January 13-27), or use CUline (see page 12) to check lists of all available courses, open courses that meet core-curriculum requirements, and open courses by meeting time.

Please note: Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit. (See page 12.) You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

Wait-List Positions and Enrollment

When you place your name on a wait list, the total number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions change during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods, it's a good idea to call CU Connect and list your schedule often to find out your position on the wait list. (See the instructions on page 20.) If you are wait listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) is announced when you list your schedule. (**Note:** From January 9 to 13, CU Connect can only tell you your wait-list position when you list your schedule *after* 9:00 p.m.) However, beginning January 9, you can find out your wait-list position at any schedule-adjustment site. CU Connect cannot tell you what "type" of wait list you're on.

It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, drop the course as soon as possible by entering 3* on CU Connect, followed by the course call number. Other students will be waiting to enroll in the course from the wait list. If you fail to drop a course by January 27, you are charged tuition for the course based on your number of credit hours. Also, if you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an *F* for that course.

Deadlines for Wait Lists

You may place your name on course wait lists until **midnight, Tuesday, January 24**. At that time, all wait lists are frozen.

If you are on a wait list as of January 25 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. There is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after January 24. All department wait lists are canceled at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, January 27, the last day to drop and add classes.

Wait Lists for Labs and Recitations

If you are closed out of a lecture course that has a lab or recitation, you can only be placed on a wait list for the lecture portion of the course. Once you are enrolled in the lecture course from the wait list, you must then add the lab and/or recitation via CU Connect.

You must be enrolled in required labs and recitations by January 27, the last day of the final schedule-adjustment period.

RECEIVING YOUR SCHEDULE

If you register by December 22, your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker will be mailed to your permanent address.

If you make significant changes to your class schedule after you receive it in the mail and/or need another copy of your schedule or you need a replacement ID validation sticker, you can get a printout of your schedule and bill and a replacement ID validation sticker in room 1 of the Coors Events/Conference Center, January 9-10, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (except on January 10 from 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) On January 11 and 12, printouts of your schedule and bill and replacement ID validation stickers are available on the upper concourse level, Coors Events/Conference Center, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

If you register after December 22, you may pick up your schedule/bill and have your ID validated on January 9, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and January 10 from 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center, conference level, room 3.

On January 11 and 12, you may pick up your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker at the upper concourse level, Coors Events/Conference Center, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. January 13-27, pick up your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker at Regent, room 1B60.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822.

Validating Your ID

When you receive your ID validation sticker, affix it to the lower right-hand corner on the picture side of your CU-Boulder photo ID. Be sure not to cover your name and student number.

If you received a base-fees sticker and add more than one course, you now need a full-fees sticker. You may obtain the proper validation sticker at the Coors Events/Conference Center January 9-12, Regent 1B60 January 13-27, or in Regent 105 after January 27.

There is a \$2 charge for replacement ID validation stickers, except January 9-12 at the Coors Events/Conference Center and January 13 at Regent 1B60, when replacement ID validation stickers are free.

Note: CU-Boulder photo IDs and ID validation stickers are not transferable. Any person who uses the CU-Boulder photo ID or ID validation sticker of another student or allows his or her ID to be used by another student may be subject to disciplinary action.

Understanding Your Schedule

Your class schedule lists the courses for which you are registered. If a message instead of a course title is listed, or if a course you requested does not appear, you are not registered for that course.

Some reasons you may not have been enrolled in a course are listed below.

“STUDENT INELIGIBLE FOR COURSE”

- **Class Restriction.** Class enrollment may be limited by class level or to students who have earned a certain number of hours by the end of the fall semester. Class restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.

- **Controlled Enrollment.** Special authorization is required from the department before requesting the course. See the department for more information.

- **Major Restriction.** Enrollment is limited to students in specific majors, colleges, or schools. These restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.

“COURSE CANCELED”

Either the course or section you requested was canceled. Contact the department for additional information or try adding a different section or course.

ADJUSTING YOUR SCHEDULE

You may use CU Connect to list your schedule and to make changes during the final schedule-adjustment period (the first three weeks of the spring semester, January 9 through January 27).

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822.

Schedule-Adjustment Time Assignments

Time assignments during the final schedule-adjustment period are based on the last two digits of your student number. **This time assignment is for both computer terminals and CU Connect.** Time assignments ensure that there is not too large a volume of students calling CU Connect or going to computer terminals all at once.

CU Connect does not allow early transactions; therefore, you are not able to drop or add courses either through CU Connect or at a computer terminal until your time assignment begins. In addition, time assignments are rotated each semester to ensure fairness.

Schedule-adjustment (drop/add) time assignments are indicated as follows and do not appear on the schedule/bill you receive in the mail.

Complete the form on page 115 of this handbook, filling out call numbers, department abbreviations, and course numbers of courses that you want to drop and/or add to your schedule. Because there may be many closed courses, have several alternate courses listed. Lists of available courses can be found at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12), in Regent 1B60 (January 13-27), Regent 105, and on CUline.

To add a controlled enrollment or independent study course, see page 11.

Adjusting Your Schedule at a Computer Terminal

- Computer terminals are available in academic departments (January 9-27), the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12), and Regent 1B60 (January 13-27).

To change your schedule at a computer terminal (during the final schedule-adjustment period of January 9 through January 27), go to any of the computer terminal locations set up throughout campus. You may adjust your schedule any time after your schedule-adjustment time assignment begins through the schedule-adjustment deadline. Your photo ID is required to change your schedule at a computer terminal.

Take your schedule-adjustment form (filled out), this handbook, and your photo ID with you to a terminal.

When adjusting your schedule at a computer terminal, you must have the course department, the course number, and the section number. (Refer to your completed schedule-adjustment form on page 115.)

When you go to an academic department, you can do all of your schedule-adjustment activity for any department or college at that location. (See pages 34-35.)

Changing Credit Status

In order to make any section change or a change of pass/fail, no credit, or variable-credit status over the phone or at an academic department, a course must be dropped and then immediately added. If you make these changes by phone or at an academic department, there is the possibility that you will not be able to add the course back once you have dropped it. It is best, therefore, to make these changes at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12) or in Regent 1B60 (January 13-27).

Adjusting Your Schedule by Phone

You may drop and add courses via CU Connect any time after your schedule-adjustment time assignment begins. To adjust your schedule by phone, follow the confirmed-registration instructions on page 19.

Deadline for Schedule Adjustment (Drop/Add)

The deadline to drop and add courses for spring semester 1995 is **4:00 p.m., Friday, January 27**. After this deadline, no adds are permitted unless there are extenuating circumstances, and no tuition adjustments are made for dropped courses.

To add a course after January 27, you must contact your dean's office and have both your instructor's and your dean's approval on a special action form.

Between January 27 and February 21 (4:00 p.m.), you must be passing a course to drop it, and a special action form must be completed and signed by your instructor and turned in to the registrar's office.

After February 21, you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.). To drop a class after this date, you must have your instructor's approval, as well as the approval of your dean. Their signatures must be on a special action form, or your request will not be processed.

Administrative Drops

Administrative drops are initiated by departments. If you have not met all the course requirements or do not attend your courses regularly during the first few weeks, you may be administratively dropped from any course. Check with departments for policies concerning administrative drops.

List Your Schedule Often!

List your schedule often via CU Connect to verify your enrollment and to find out your position on wait lists.

FINDING OUT YOUR POSITION ON A WAIT LIST

If you are on a wait list and you list your schedule via CU Connect, CU Connect tells you your specific position on the list. (**Exception:** From January 9-13, you can only hear your wait-list position when you list your schedule *after* 9:00 p.m.) Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly.

Check your schedule often, using the list option (see page 20) to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you forget that you are on a wait list and are placed in a course and fail to drop it by January 27, you may be charged for the course, and you will receive an *F*, even if you do not attend the class.

VERIFYING YOUR SCHEDULE

List your schedule to verify your courses and make any appropriate adjustments before the final schedule-adjustment deadline (4:00 p.m. on January 27).

- *Tuition for a 0-credit-hour course is charged at the rate of a 3-credit-hour course.*

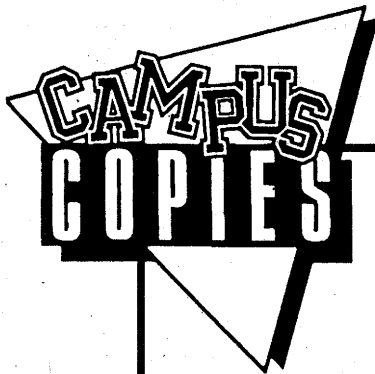

TUITION AND FEES

University of Colorado Student Union (UCSU) Student Fees

UCSU student fees of \$180.25 are mandatory and may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If your fees are waived, you must still pay the base fee of \$35.92. If you wish to petition for a waiver of UCSU fees, you must do so by 4:00 p.m. on January 20. *No late petitions are accepted.*

Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees. **Note:** Students covered by the University student health insurance cannot waive their full student fees.

All Boulder main-campus students taking one course of 5 or fewer credit hours are assessed a base fee of \$35.92 and receive a base-fees ID validation sticker for their photo ID. These students are not allowed to use Wardenburg Student Health Center or the Recreation Center unless they pay separate, one-time user fees or full student fees.

Doctoral students taking thesis hours only and master's candidates for degree taking thesis hours only are only assessed the base fees, unless they have the student health insurance. Then, they must pay full student fees. Approved doctoral candidates are assessed only the base fees unless they have the student health insurance, and then they pay doctoral fees of \$88.68.

Mandatory Fee Information

In addition to UCSU student fees, all students are assessed an RTD bus-pass fee of \$12.00 each semester. This pass entitles you to free unlimited ridership, using your validated student ID, on local, regional, and express bus routes.

Those students registered for 4 or more credit hours are assessed an athletic fee of \$28.50 each semester. Students are also charged a fee for basic computing and information services: Students enrolled for 6 or fewer credit hours are charged \$7.50; students enrolled for 7 or more credit hours are charged \$15. In addition, a Student Information System (SIS) fee of \$6 is charged to all students.

Course Fees

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, and materials that are required to teach courses in certain departments. Course fees are assessed for all courses taught in the following departments.

Various course fees also exist in the College of Architecture and Planning, the Department of Fine Arts, the School of Law, and the departments of anthropology, geography, film studies, and dance. A placement fee of \$250 per semester is assessed to all MBA students. In addition, lab courses not linked to a lecture course may require payment of a course fee.

Comments concerning course fees are welcome and should be addressed in writing to the Office of the Chancellor, Campus Box 17.

Matriculation Fee

There is a one-time, nonrefundable matriculation fee of \$15, which is assessed at the time of initial registration, for students entering a program and for new degree students. Non-degree students who are admitted to degree status are assessed the matriculation fee at the time of their first registration after they have become degree-seeking students.

Enrollment Deposit

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the University until you graduate or officially withdraw from the University within established dates and guidelines (see page 33 for the "Withdrawal Refund or Assessment Schedule"). At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you within approximately eight weeks. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

If you elect to enroll at the University in the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established University policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

Residency

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for spring 1995 should turn in residency petitions by 4:00 p.m., December 30, 1994, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, Campus Box 68, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through January 13, 1995, but students do not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

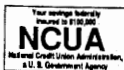

Students submitting a completed petition by November 1, 1994, receive a decision by the enrollment-deposit refund deadline of December 30. Financial-aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by November 1, 1994, to make sure their financial-aid award is processed in time for spring semester.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state residency status is available from the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 1B54, or by calling (303) 492-6868.

Student Health Insurance

All students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more are automatically assessed \$440 for Plan A of the student health insurance, unless they submitted a selection/waiver form in the fall 1994 semester. If you drop below 6 credit hours by January 27, 1995, the charge for insurance is automatically removed from your bill.

The insurance provides up to 100-percent coverage for eligible medical costs incurred at Wardenburg Student Health Center (WSHC). It also provides 75- to 100-percent coverage at other medical facilities, after a deductible is satisfied. (This is dependent upon the type of service rendered and the provider.) The plan provides up to \$250,000 in coverage per illness or injury on a world-wide basis. Benefits are provided all year round when both fall and spring semester coverage are purchased.

If you are taking 5 or fewer credit hours, or you are enrolled in SAVE, Continuing Education, or the Time Out Program, the University-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first pay full UCSU student fees. **Exception:** Approved doctoral candidates requesting student group insurance are charged full price for the insurance, and UCSU student fees may be reduced. If you are taking 5 or fewer semester hours or you are in one of the programs listed above and you wish to enroll in the student health plan, you must sign up at WSHC.

If you hold at least a 20% appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant, or as a graduate part-time instructor, you are eligible for a contribution toward student insurance. The University will contribute a portion of the cost toward either Option A or B.

If you do not wish to purchase University health insurance, complete a waiver to remove this charge from your bill. To be honored, waivers must be turned in to WSHC by January 20, 1995. A **selection/waiver form need not be submitted in the spring semester if one was submitted in the fall 1994 semester, unless you wish to change the insurance option.**

For information on other insurance options or if you have questions, call the Student Insurance Office at (303) 492-5107.

PAYING YOUR BILL

You may pay your bill by a personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado. If you decide to pay in cash, make your payment at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent. If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes in the lobby and at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.*

The payment deadline is 4:00 p.m. on Friday, January 20, 1995.

Note: All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the University.

Permanent drop boxes are located outside Regent Administrative Center at the north and south entrances. The boxes are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to make a payment on any bills owed to the Bursar's Office. Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for additional drop box locations.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent Hall, Room 175, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

If you are using the U.S. Postal Service, mail your payment early. **The University must receive your payment by January 20. Postmark dates are not honored.** If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time.

The Bursar's Office hours from January 9 to 20 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

For your convenience, the Bursar's Office has evening hours on Tuesday, January 17, and is open 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for billing questions, tuition payment, refund-check distribution, deferred tuition, and short-term loans.

First-Time Federal Direct Student Loan Borrowers ONLY

Loan funds are delayed until approximately February 8 for undergraduate students in the first year of a program or undergraduate transfer students with less than 30 hours at CU-Boulder who are borrowing a federal loan for the first time at CU-Boulder. Late and service charges are not assessed on the amount of the loan proceeds for these students. Therefore, for all balances as of January 20, 1995, late payment and service charges are assessed on the unpaid balance *minus* the amount of the delayed loan proceeds disbursed for spring 1995.

Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

If you foresee any problems in paying your bill in full by the January 20th deadline, you can elect to defer up to one-half of your balance due. By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on January 20. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is reduced automatically by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced. If there are changes, you can access CULine-PLUS for your current bill information, or call (303) 492-5091 for your current balance.

On February 24, you must pay the balance of your bill, plus a one-percent finance charge and any charges added to your bill after your bill is produced. A second bill reflecting this balance is

mailed to your local address the first week in February. **Make sure your address is current.**

If you do not receive a schedule/bill in the mail, or if the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent Hall.

Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

University policy requires that a financial stop be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline.

Colorado law requires the University to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services Office. If your account is referred to a collection agency, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge on the unpaid balance (one-percent per month), is assessed according to the following schedule:

Personal Check Policy

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the University, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the University. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes. Specific inquiries

concerning reporting of bad checks should be directed to the Student Debt Management department in the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5571.

Failure to Complete Financial Transactions/Financial Stops

If you fail to pay your bill, miss payment deadlines, or write delinquent checks to the University, you are subject to late fees, finance charges, and financial stops.

Financial stops prevent you from registering for any future terms, receiving a diploma, dropping or adding classes, or receiving an academic transcript of work at the University; you may also be withdrawn from the University for future terms.

Direct Lending

The University of Colorado at Boulder was one of 104 schools selected to participate in the federal direct lending program for 1994-95. As a result, *all Federal Stafford and PLUS loan proceeds are applied directly to your tuition and fee bill.* If your financial aid pays your bill in full, and there is money remaining, you are entitled to a refund (see below).

If you are not eligible for a refund or the amount of the refund does not cover additional expenses, *i.e.*, books, food, rent, you must plan accordingly.

Getting Your Refund Check

A recent survey indicated students would prefer their refund checks be mailed at the beginning of the semester. Refund checks resulting from financial aid credits on tuition bills are mailed as stated below.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, or if financial aid is applied to your account by January 4 that results in a credit balance, a refund check is mailed

to your local mailing address on January 7. **Make sure your address is current.**

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after January 4, a refund check is available at the cashiers window in Regent Hall. (Locations may change. Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for updated information.) You must have your photo ID with you to pick up your check. Checks not picked up are mailed on a monthly basis.

Tuition and Fee Information from CULine-PLUS

Do you need to know how much you owe on your tuition and fee bill? Has your financial aid (including loan proceeds) been applied to your bill and is a refund check available to pick up? What is the due date of the next tuition and fee bill?

All these questions can be answered by accessing CULine-PLUS anytime, including nights and weekends, at various terminals located around the campus. (See page 12 for CULine terminal locations.) If you have any questions regarding tuition information on CULine-PLUS, call the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381.

You may also call the Office of Financial Aid's automated phone system at (303) 492-5091 to obtain this information. Refer to the "Automated Phone System" section on page 31.

FINANCIAL AID

If you meet all of the qualifications to receive financial aid funds, your scholarship, grant, or loan proceeds are automatically applied to your bill. (Look up your bill on CUline-PLUS, if your financial aid does not appear on your bill.)

All loans borrowed under the Federal Direct Student Loan Program are credited to your University bill, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria to receive your financial aid.

Note: If you are or will be working on two majors (same degree), receiving financial aid, and don't plan to graduate from both majors at the same time, your financial aid may be in jeopardy. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the basement of Environmental Design, or call (303) 492-5091.

First-Time Federal Direct Student Loan Borrowers

All students borrowing a federal loan for the first time at CU-Boulder are required to watch a video that outlines the responsibilities of borrowing federal funds. Once the video has been viewed, the loan funds can be applied to your tuition and fee bill. Refer to CUline for times and locations of entrance interviews.

If you accepted a fall/spring loan (including PLUS), the total amount of the loan is divided evenly between the fall and spring semesters. If you borrow a spring loan only, one-half of the net amount is applied January 9, and the remaining loan funds are applied halfway through the semester. (Exception: First-time borrowers.)

Federal Direct Student Loans

All loans borrowed under the Federal Direct Student Loan Program are credited to your University bill, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria to receive your financial aid.

Refund Checks

Refund checks for any financial aid (including direct-loan proceeds) in excess of your tuition and fee bill are mailed to your local mailing address. (See "Getting Your Refund Check" on page 30.)

Federal Perkins Loans

If you are awarded and accept your spring Federal Perkins loan and sign your promissory note, the loan is applied to your bill. If you did not sign the promissory note, refer to information included with your schedule/bill for instructions.

Beginning January 24, you may sign your promissory note at the Office of Financial Aid, Environmental Design, room 2. If you have questions about Federal Perkins loans, call (303) 492-5091, and press *H.

Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans for students are available through the Office of Financial Aid during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least 18 years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (SAVE and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer who is either a faculty or staff member or a student at CU-Boulder. The maximum amount that you

can borrow is \$500, and the loan must be paid back to the University within 30 days.

You may also seek a short-term loan from the University of Colorado Federal Credit Union. Criteria for that loan can be obtained directly from the Credit Union at (303) 443-4672.

Reasonable Academic Progress

In order to receive financial aid, you must maintain reasonable academic progress toward a degree. This policy is published in a fact sheet and is available at the Office of Financial Aid, Environmental Design, room 2.

Automated Phone System

You may call the Financial Aid Office's automated phone system from a touch-tone phone to request services or receive financial aid information (day or night). Have your student ID number and PIN ready. Call 492-5091, and press 1 and 1 again to access your financial aid file, or press 2 for Student Employment. To speak with a financial aid advisor, call between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and press *H.

Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0106, or call (303) 492-7322 for further information.

OTHER REGISTRATIONS

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822.

Concurrent Registration

- Obtain forms in Regent 105 beginning January 3.

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the spring and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final schedule-adjustment period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all classes.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning January 3. For information, call (303) 492-6581.

Note to Graduate Students: Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

High School Nondegree Registration

The high school nondegree program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is held through the SAVE program. Please contact Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148.

Intercampus Registration

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus, you may be able to register directly on that campus. However, you must apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campuses except in the summer.)

Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for spring 1995, you must complete registration by 10:00 p.m. on January 6. If you do not register by this date (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories for late registration are allowed to register, and lower registration priority and a \$20 late fee is applied. Remember that many courses are full by this time.

If you are a continuing student, call (303) 492-4822 beginning at 9:00 a.m. on January 9 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new student, go to Admissions Operations (492-2451) in Regent 1B65. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 9-12) to be set up for late registration.

On-Campus Registration

- *Deadline to register is January 6.*

If by December 30 you have not received registration materials for spring and you

are not required to attend an orientation, you may pick up registration materials in Regent 105 between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., January 3-6. (**Exception:** New freshmen and transfer students in arts and sciences or business receive registration materials at orientation on January 5-6.)

You must complete telephone registration by 10:00 p.m., January 6. For more information, call the registrar's office at (303) 492-6970.

Registration for Faculty and Staff

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 free credit hours each year. The academic year begins with the summer session, and the number of free credit hours is determined on a prorated basis from full-time employment status. Beginning January 10, enrollment is held on a space-available basis in conjunction with late registration, unless you wish to register early. If so, register via CU Connect by January 6; full tuition and fees are charged.

If you take a course(s) as a nondegree student, you must take a copy of your current Personnel Action Form (PAF) and a nondegree-student application to the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, by December 2, 1994. If you were enrolled as a nondegree student on the Boulder campus during fall semester 1994, you are set up automatically for spring 1995, but you must apply for free credit hours each semester. A current PAF is required for each semester for which a waiver is needed.

You are assessed the student computing fee, the Student Information System fee, and the \$12.00 RTD bus pass fee, and all applicable course fees are mandatory. Refer to the "Course Fees" section on page 27 for additional information.

OTHER REGISTRATIONS/WITHDRAWING

You must take course work outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to your employing department. For more information, call (303) 492-4369 or 492-3048.

Space-Available (SAVE) Registration

Nondegree students may take Boulder campus courses on a space-available basis. Register at the Coors Events/Conference Center, January 12-13, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Tuition charges are identical to CU-Boulder rates, and payment is due in full upon enrollment.

Note: Out-of-state students who want to register for 3 credit hours or less through SAVE are assessed the in-state tuition rate. (Degree students must obtain approval from their dean, and out-of-state students registered for 4 hours or more through SAVE are assessed at the regular out-of-state tuition rate.)

When you register for the Boulder campus SAVE program, you pay Continuing Education for those courses. If you are a newly admitted degree student who has not completed a semester on the Boulder main campus, you must register as a nondegree student through SAVE and reapply through the Office of Admissions when you want to return to the University. Be aware of the number of hours you can take as nondegree student that will transfer to a degree program. For eligibility information, call Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148.

Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from spring semester 1995 *before* January 27, fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, CU-Boulder, Campus Box 7, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. You do not need to drop your courses; this is done for you.

If you withdraw *after* the third week of the semester (January 27), you must complete a withdrawal interview to discuss procedures for withdrawing and your reasons for leaving.

If you do not officially withdraw from the University, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses. **Remember:** Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.

If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see page 17) or reapply through the Office of Admissions.

Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

- 1000-2999 Lower-division courses (generally appropriate for freshmen and sophomores)
- 3000-4999 Upper-division courses (primarily for juniors and seniors)
- 5000-5999 Courses intended for graduate students, but may be open to qualified undergraduates under some circumstances (see individual faculty)
- 6000-8999 Courses open to graduate students only (See individual department offices for special provisions.)

Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of course listings, in order from left to right, include:

- Core Diamonds**—A diamond (♦) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core-curriculum requirement.
- Department**—The department name, abbreviated to four letters.
- Course Number**—The four-digit number used to identify the course.
- Credits**—The number of credit hours offered for the course.

Course Title—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

Section Number—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an **R** or **L** precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R) or a laboratory (L). When a recitation or lab section is indicated, it must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses have all three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

Call Number—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect.

Time/Days—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

Building/Room—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See the campus map for the building abbreviations.)

Instructor—The instructor's name, when available.

Maximum Enrollment—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

Remember: Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect will inform you with an appropriate message.

Sunday, August 27

- Classes begin. (Note that classes begin on a Monday.)

Friday, September 8

- Deadline to drop and add courses without the instructor's and/or dean's signature. (Note that this deadline is earlier than in previous semesters.)

Refer to the academic calendar on pages 4 and 5 for other fall 1995 semester dates.

This description of the core curriculum contains a number of changes approved by the faculty of the college in spring 1994. **This version applies to all students first enrolling in the college in summer 1994 and later.** The specific changes include credit-hour requirement updates, as follows:

1. Written Communication requires 3 hours of approved lower-division course work and 3 hours of approved upper-division course work.
2. Historical Context requires 3 hours of approved course work.
3. United States Context requires 3 hours of approved course work.
4. Contemporary Societies requires 3 hours of approved course work.

Continuing students who first enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences *before* summer 1994 may elect to graduate under the new set of core curriculum requirements. These continuing students may satisfy the written communication requirement by passing 3 hours of approved upper-division course work *or* by passing the written communication proficiency test.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 110). You may *not* use courses taken to complete a MAPS deficiency to fulfill any area of the core curriculum, with the exception of foreign language.

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the *University of Colorado Catalog*.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 4, 5, and 6 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one requirement.

Skills Acquisition

1. FOREIGN LANGUAGE

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you are required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination. 3. WRITTEN COMMUNICATION

Students may meet the lower-division component of this requirement by first passing one of the approved lower-division courses or by receiving a score of 3, 4, or 5 on the English Language and Composition Advanced Placement exam.

Students may then complete the upper-division component of this requirement by passing one of the approved upper-division courses or by passing the written communication proficiency exam.

Minimum Academic Preparation Standards

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

English	4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
Mathematics	3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
Natural Science	3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
Social Science	3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
Foreign Language	completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

POLICIES CONCERNING THE COMPLETION OF MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
 2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
 3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
 4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
 5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
 6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.
