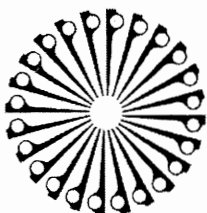


WELCOME



STUDENT ART CONTEST

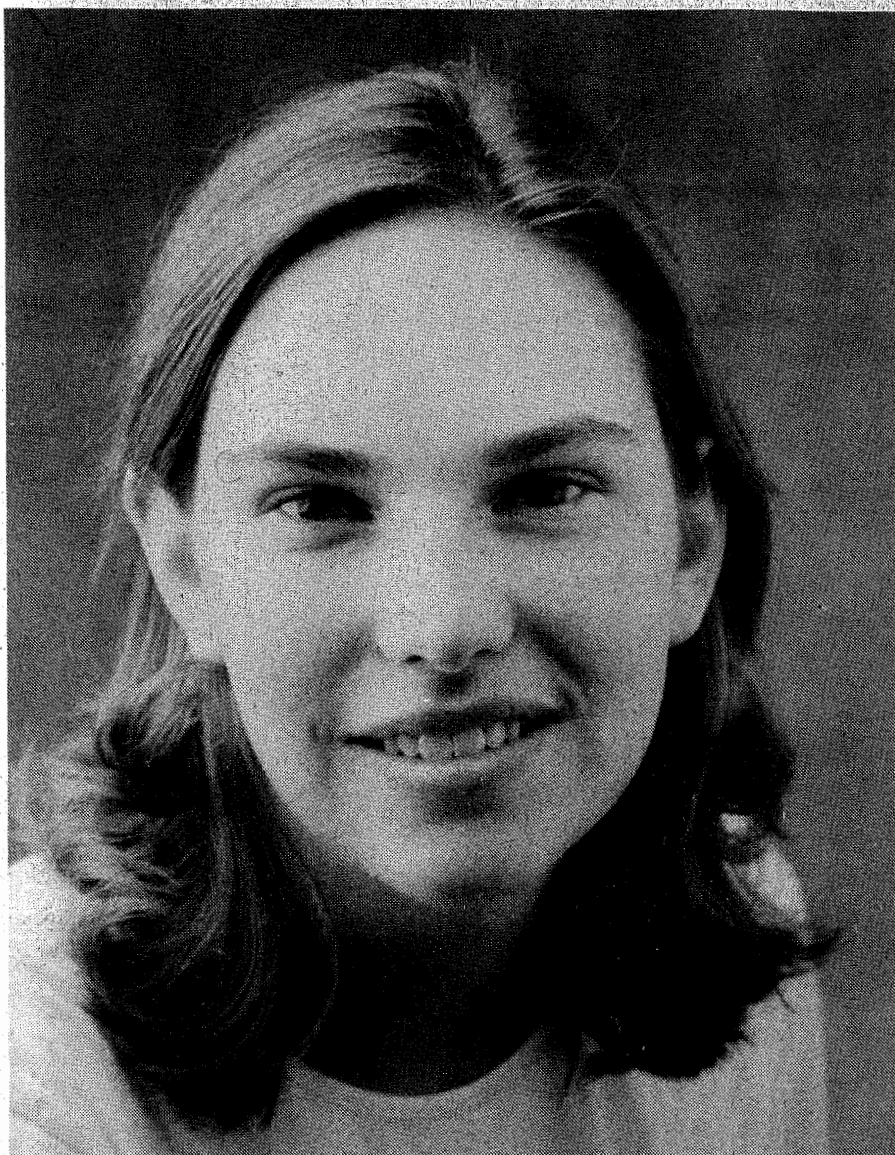
[The following narrative is written by the artist of the winning art work, Erin E. Hicks.]

Before attending the University, I studied painting and art history for three semesters at a two-year college in Madison, Wisconsin. After a time, I decided to transfer to CU in order to attain a BFA in painting as well as a BA in art history.

Most of my work during the past four years has focused on painting. However, I have recently developed an interest in printmaking and papermaking, and my work now typically incorporates aspects of these three mediums. I will graduate in December 1996, with plans to continue painting and to show my art work in the future.

Abstract 3 is an oil-based viscosity monoprint that was simply motivated by the results of the printmaking process. By layering ink and then scratching the ink away, the use of viscosity monoprinting emphasizes the gestural quality of line and form within the print. The placement of abstract shapes and pattern, along with color and brushstroke, serves to create the depth and motion of the piece.

I would like to thank the University for selecting my piece as the contest winner. I greatly appreciate the prize money, as well as the honor of being chosen.

REGISTRATION/ACADEMIC CALENDAR

OCTOBER 24 (THURS.) - NOVEMBER 1 (FRI.)

- Spring 1997 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 12 of the *Fall 1996 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

NOVEMBER 4 (MON.) - DECEMBER 3 (TUES.)

- Spring 1997 confirmed-registration time assignments for students enrolled during fall 1996. Continuing students can continue registering for the spring semester through January 9 (8:00 p.m.). For best course selections, register as close to your time assignment as possible.

DECEMBER 4 (WED.) - JANUARY 9 (THURS.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed confirmed registration.
- Spring 1997 confirmed registration for new graduate and readmitted students not required to attend an orientation.

DECEMBER 13 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your permanent address to ensure that your spring 1997 schedule/bill and ID validation sticker are mailed to the correct address.

DECEMBER 16 (MON.)

- Spring 1997 schedule/bill and ID validation stickers are mailed to permanent address.

DECEMBER 20 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to register and receive a schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. Students who register after this date can pick up their schedule/bill and ID validation sticker at the Coors Events/Conference Center on January 10.

DECEMBER 31 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for continuing students to withdraw from the University and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. - **Deadline** to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition, by 5:00 p.m. **No grace period.**

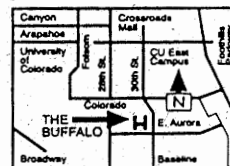

SPRING 1997 FINAL EXAMINATIONS

The following final examination schedules list all final exams by meeting pattern, exam time, and common exams.

If you have three or more final exams scheduled on the same day, you are entitled to arrange an alternative exam time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. To qualify for rescheduling final exam times, you must provide evidence that you have three or more exams on the same day, and arrangements must be made with your instructor no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (Friday, February 21, 1997).

REGISTRATION OVERVIEW

Confirmed Registration

All students participate in confirmed registration for spring semester 1997. (See pages 21-23). Confirmed registration takes place throughout the months of November, December, and the beginning of January.

You may drop and add courses anytime after you register, through January 9 (8:00 p.m.). CU Connect, the telephone registration system, will also be available for you to adjust your schedule once the spring semester begins.

Orientation

New freshmen and transfer students in arts and sciences, business, and engineering are required to attend an orientation in January. These students will receive their registration materials and register at the mandatory orientation.

New freshmen and transfer students in music are also required to attend an orientation in January. However, these students will be mailed their registration materials by the registrar's office after they have confirmed their admission and should complete registration prior to their orientation.

There is no orientation for new freshmen and transfer students in Architecture and Planning. However, these students are encouraged to call their dean's office for advising. These students will be mailed their registration materials by the registrar's office after they have confirmed their admission.

Registration Deadline

All students must complete registration by **8:00 p.m. on January 9, 1997** to be guaranteed enrollment for spring semester 1997. Students who do not register by this date (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a \$50 late fee.

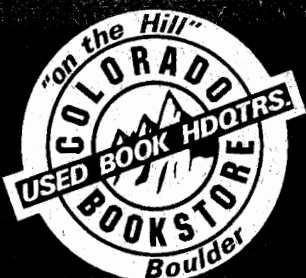
Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for spring 1997, you must complete registration by **8:00 p.m. on January 9**. If you do not register by this deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration, and lower registration priority and a \$50 late fee are applied. Remember that many courses are full by this time.

If you are a continuing student, call (303) 492-4822 on January 10 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to Admissions Operations in Regent 1B65 (492-2451) to check for eligibility.

Students who are eligible for late registration must then go to the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10 and 12-14), or to Regent 1B60 (January 15-24) to be set up for late registration.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Before you register, read the following information. Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered here. The information is listed by subject or topic and is in alphabetical order.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5871 (TTY).

Addresses—Very Important!

- *Keep your addresses updated at all times.*

Two addresses on your student record must be kept current: your mailing address and your permanent address.

Your **mailing address** is your address during the school year, e.g., the residence hall, apartment, or house where you live during the fall and spring semesters. Your invitation to register, outstanding tuition and fee bills, refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May. (**Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.)

Your **permanent address** is considered your “home-base” address. It can be your parents’ address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills and ID validation stickers are mailed to this address before the semester begins. In addition, financial-aid notifications are mailed to your permanent address. This address is used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break.

Note that you can have a different address for mailing and permanent or the same address for both. Also note that these addresses are used by the Office of the Registrar, Bursar’s Office, and Office of Financial Aid. Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> (see page 13) and, if needed, fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Environmental Design, room 2, or by calling (303) 492-6581. You can also update your address by sending an e-mail to change.address@colorado.edu. Be sure to indicate which address type you’re updating.

Advising

- *Check your invitation to register for advising requirements!*
- *See pages 42-43 for academic department locations and phone numbers.*

If you are required by your college or school to consult with an advisor *before* registering for courses, you are notified on

your invitation to register (see page 14) or when you call CU Connect. If you receive such a message and you are an arts and sciences or engineering student, call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean’s office to make arrangements for advising (see page 44 for phone numbers). If you are a student in any other college or school and you receive an advising message, call your dean’s office.

After you have been advised and the restriction is removed by your advising department or dean’s office, you may call CU Connect to register.

The Office of Undergraduate Academic Affairs (Willard 226, 492-4433) can help with general advising issues. Within this office, the Advising Resource Center (492-8811) has advisors to help “open option” students or students who are thinking of changing their major. Peer advisors are also available to help students with both academic and personal concerns. In addition, some colleges hold workshops for students on general education requirements (core curriculum and college list).

Changing Your Major

If you want to change or declare a major, go to the new major department and ask about the required procedures. If your change of major involves moving into another college or school, an intrauniversity transfer (IUT) must be done.

Note: If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don’t plan to graduate with both majors (or your major and minor) at the same time, your financial aid may be in jeopardy. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the basement of Environmental Design, or call (303) 492-5091.

Confidentiality of Student Records

Annual Notice to Students: The University of Colorado complies fully with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974. The act was designed to protect the privacy of education records, to establish the right of students to inspect and review their education records in all offices, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Students also have the right to file complaints with the FERPA office concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the act.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Local policy explains in detail the procedures to be used by the institution for compliance with the provisions of the act. Copies of the policy can be found in the government publications office in Norlin Library, the Law Library, and the Office of the Registrar.

The registrar has been designated by the institution to coordinate the inspection and review of student education records located in various University offices. *Students wishing to review their education records must come to the Office of the Registrar and present proper identification. All other records inquiries must be directed to the proper office, i.e., Financial Aid, Bursar's Office, etc.*

Students *may not* inspect the following, as outlined by the act: financial information submitted by their parents; confidential letters that they have waived their rights to review; or education records containing information about more than one student, in which case the institution will permit access *only* to that part of the record that pertains to the inquiring student. Records that may be inspected include admissions, academic, and financial aid files, and cooperative education and placement records.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of your education records. However, certain information is considered public or "directory" information. Such information may be released to anyone, unless you direct the Office of the Registrar, in writing, to not disclose your directory information.

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado as public or "directory" information: name, address, telephone number, dates of attendance, registration status, class, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, and date and place of birth. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion.

No other information regarding a student's education records may be disclosed to anyone without the written consent of the student, *except* for personnel within the institution, officials of other institutions in which the student seeks to enroll, persons or organizations providing the student with financial aid (this includes parents upon whom the student is financially dependent), accrediting agencies carrying out their accreditation functions, and persons in an emergency to protect the health or safety of the student or other persons.

Currently enrolled students may withhold disclosure of directory information under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. To withhold disclosure, students

should inquire at the registrar's office by the tenth day of classes in a semester. Once requested, nondisclosure remains in effect until the student is no longer enrolled or requests that the nondisclosure request be discontinued. The University of Colorado assumes that failure on the part of any student to specifically request the withholding of directory information indicates individual approval for disclosure.

A complete summary of University policy on the release of student information is available in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*, *Ralphie's Guide to Student Life*, and at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105. For further information, call (303) 492-6907.

Controlled Enrollment and Independent Study Courses

• *You must receive authorization from the sponsoring department to register for these courses.*

Enrollment in courses with a 740-799, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff either gives you the five-digit course call number so you can register for the course via CU Connect, enrolls you in the course directly on the computer, or gives you a special action form to take to a central drop/add site (during the final drop/add period *only*) or to the registrar's office.

Course Reservation Program

The Course Reservation Program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder, which utilize waitlists, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the Course Reservation Program.

You are eligible to participate in the Course Reservation Program for *fall 1997* if your name is on a wait list for a course as of midnight on January 21, and you don't get enrolled in the course. **Note:** This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that may be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of midnight on January 21, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., between March 17 and March 27 to register for the course for fall 1997. Registrations will *not* be honored through the Course Reservation Program after March 27. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You will register for all other fall 1997 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions

During the registration period, undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), *including wait-listed courses.*

During the final drop/add period, undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, *including wait-listed courses.* **Note:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

Once you complete registration, check with your college or school to determine the maximum number of credit hours that can be counted toward your degree each semester. Remember that 12 credit hours is considered a full-time undergraduate student load for financial aid and for enrollment-verification purposes. (Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for their full-and part-time status definitions for graduate students.) It is considered normal progress towards graduating in four years in most undergraduate programs if you carry 15 credit hours per semester.

Credit and Grading Options

- You can select or change credit and grading options through 5:00 p.m. on January 24.
- Courses taken for no credit or pass/fail cannot apply toward a graduate degree.

No Credit. To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option. (Press *1 after the course call number, then #.) You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used. **Note:** No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes.

Pass/Fail. Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option. (Press *2 after the course call number, then #.)

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is *not* noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

Note: If you attempt to change the status of a course from or to P/F or NC by telephone, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. You can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course at the registrar's office in Regent 105 (through January 9), at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10 and 12-14), or in Regent 1B60 (January 15 - 24), by filling out a credit-option form.

You can select or change credit and grading options throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m. on January 24 (the drop/add deadline).

Variable Credit. All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you call CU Connect to register, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m., Friday, January 24 (the drop/add deadline).

Double-Degree Programs

If you are working in a double-degree program (for example, obtaining one degree from arts and sciences and one from business), check to see that both degree programs are on your invitation to register. (For a sample invitation to register, see page 14.) If both colleges are not on the invitation, you may not be able to register for required courses in both colleges. If you have questions concerning your double-degree program, check with your deans' offices.

Graduation

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation policies, application deadlines, and notification procedures. Some colleges and schools require you to come in for a consultation the semester before the semester you plan to graduate.

Arts and sciences students getting ready to graduate must meet specific deadlines to allow sufficient time for University processing. Follow the deadlines below to help you graduate on time. (When the deadlines fall on a weekend or holiday, use the next working day.)

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the University. Failure to do so will result in a stop on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work completed at the University and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the University Student Loans department in the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

On January 9, 10 and 13, the Photo ID Office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. On January 14, regular office hours of 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. resume.

You must have a picture ID with you to have your student ID made. Your initial ID is free, but there is a \$10 charge for replacement IDs. (Continuing education and SAVE students do not receive an initial free ID; they are charged \$10 for an ID. However, SAVE students who choose to pay student fees receive an initial CU-Boulder photo ID free.)

CU-Boulder photo ID cards and ID validation stickers are not transferable. Any person who uses the CU-Boulder photo ID or ID validation sticker of another student or allows his or her validated ID to be used by another student may be subject to disciplinary action.

When getting a replacement ID (\$10) at the Photo ID Office, the replacement ID validation sticker is free. If you only need a replacement ID validation sticker, you can get one free of charge at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10, 12-15). Replacement ID validation stickers (\$2) are available at the Photo ID Office (beginning January 16), in Regent 1B60 (January 16-24), or in Regent 105 (beginning January 27).

Note: You must show your CU-Boulder photo ID in order to get a replacement ID validation sticker.

PLUS: Viewing Your Records On-Line

You can view the following information for your records only on PLUS (Personal Look Up Services) on the World Wide Web by using your University student number and Personal Identification Number (PIN):

- grades for the two most recent terms
- degree program information (primary and secondary college, major, and class standing)
- registration status (advising requirements and registration time-assignment)
- class schedule for the current term, the two most recent terms, and all future terms for which you have registered
- current semester billing and financial aid information
- current addresses
- degree audit (for certain colleges)

Go to <http://www.colorado.edu> (the UCB home page) and choose Student Life (PLUS) or go directly to <http://www.colorado.edu/plus/>.

Federal privacy laws and University policies guarantee your right to access your own data and protect this data from unauthorized access by others. Unauthorized access can result in student conduct disciplinary actions and/or civil and criminal proceedings. The University will provide reasonable physical and electronic security for this data, but it is up to you not to compromise the security of this information. If

you feel that your PIN is not secure, go to the registrar's office in Regent 105 to change your PIN.

Professor Performance Guide

Instructor and course evaluations published in the *Professor Performance Guide* are available during registration and can help you decide which courses and instructors to choose. The guide is the result of the Faculty Course Questionnaire that is completed by students during the last full week of classes in both fall and spring semesters. GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Special Assistance Available

The Office of the Registrar offers personal registration assistance to Spanish-speaking students, students with a disability, and students not familiar with the telephone registration system.

If you have a special need regarding registration or if you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5841 (TTY).

Stops on Your Registration

- *Check your invitation to register for stops!*

When you call CU Connect, you may get a message that you have a "stop" on your record. Stops are holds that the University puts on student records for various reasons. Stops originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. You are not allowed to register until you have cleared all your stops. Most often, a message is printed on your invitation to register indicating a stop. (See page 14 for a sample invitation.) However, stops can occur at any time in the registration process, so you should always know the status of your student record.

Student Opportunities Fees

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the University, tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and club and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use.

Student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you must call the appropriate office at the phone number listed below. Refunds will be given up to the drop/add deadline.

DESCRIPTIONS OF STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES FEES

Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, followed by the fee.

Free, year-round services are provided by **Career Services** in Willard Hall including career counseling, career-planning and job-search workshops, the career library, the alumni career network, video practice interviews, and the *Discover* computerized career-guidance system. Two fee services available from Career Services are listed below.

Career Connections \$30.00

This is for students graduating by August 1997. This fee entitles you to participate in a package of five services during the current semester: **career interviewing** (weekly interviewing opportunities), **career hotline** (current vacancies accessible by telephone), **resume referrals**, **informational meetings with employers**, and opportunities to be an **employer host**. The prime time to use this service is during your final year at CU. *Contact Career Connections during the first week of classes for scheduled dates of the mandatory orientation meeting.* 492-4100.

Cooperative Education/Internships \$45.00

This is for undergraduate and graduate students seeking work experience before graduation. Each year, more than 5,000 internships are available in business, engineering, art museums, social service agencies, and environmental and governmental agencies, etc. Contact the Co-op Office (Willard 18) early in the semester to complete the necessary materials. Full refunds are granted until the drop/add deadline. This service is good for 12 months from enrollment. 492-4129.

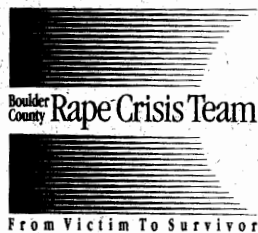

Club Sports \$3.95

Club sports are partially funded by student fees. Participants often have to pay out-of-pocket expenses, which may limit their involvement in the sport. GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Time Out Program

For those of you who would like to take a planned leave from CU-Boulder for a semester or a year, the Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity to leave the University without losing your place in your college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the University is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged. The TOP application deadline for spring semester is February 26. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, (303) 492-8673.

Note: If you are registered for the semester you plan to begin TOP, you must formally withdraw. See the withdrawal procedures and the "Withdrawal Dates/Refund or Assessment Schedule" on page 41.

Transcripts

• *Order transcripts by phone, mail, or in person in the Office of the Registrar.*

Your **unofficial transcript** is a copy of your CU academic record used for advising purposes. You may call 492-6907 or fill out a form in the lobby of Regent to request that an unofficial transcript be sent to any department on campus at

no charge. A personal unofficial copy can also be ordered for \$1 and will be available the next working day at the unofficial transcript/enrollment verification window in the foyer of Regent Hall. Same-day processing is available for an additional fee.

Your **official transcript** is the complete record of all courses you have taken at the University of Colorado, both at the undergraduate and graduate level. It contains the signature of the registrar and is printed on official security paper. Official transcripts are primarily used to support applications for transfer to other academic institutions and for employment purposes. Official transcripts are prepared and issued only at a student's request.

Official transcripts that include end-of-term grades are available approximately 10 days after final examinations; degrees are recorded approximately six weeks after graduation.

There is no charge for official transcripts. Typically, official transcripts require an average of four working days to process. However, a rush-transcript service is available for a processing fee. Official transcripts may be ordered by telephone at (303) 492-8987 or by filling out an order form in the foyer of Regent. A request with a signature may also be sent by FAX to (303) 492-4884 or mailed to: Office of the Registrar, Transcript Section, Campus Box 68, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

UCB Web Site

The UCB web site provides important information regarding registration, a listing of available courses, the final exam schedule, tuition, and more.

More than 60 terminals are located in buildings and residence halls throughout the campus. Computing labs in Business, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Hellems, Ketchum, Macky, Muenzinger, and Norlin also have web access.

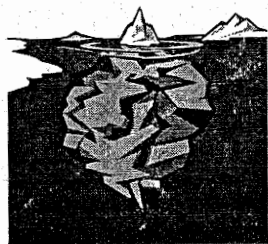

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

All students participate in confirmed registration for spring 1997. Via confirmed registration, you can call CU Connect to register for courses, list your schedule, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register via CU Connect, you find out immediately whether or not you are enrolled in a course.

If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5841 (TTY).

Receiving Your Invitation to Register

• *Your invitation to register is mailed to your mailing address and includes your registration time assignment, Personal Identification Number (PIN), your addresses, and any stops on your registration.*

Your personalized invitation to register (see page 14 for a sample invitation) indicates the date and time you can call CU Connect to register for courses. You can call any time after your time assignment begins, through 8:00 p.m. on January 9. However, confirmed registration is conducted on a first-come, first-served basis, and it's to your advantage to call as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. Classes fill up quickly throughout the registration period. *You must clear all stops before registering.*

Note: If you are a new or readmitted student for spring semester and are not required to register at an orientation session (see page 10), and you have *not* received your invitation to register by January 6, go to the registrar's office, Regent 105, to pick up registration materials. The registration deadline is 8:00 p.m. on January 9.

FINDING YOUR PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (PIN)

Your invitation to register includes your PIN. Your PIN, in combination with your student number, allows you access to CU Connect, the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the Web, and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you is available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. The PIN is a randomly set number, must be kept confidential, and remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.

If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, go to the registrar's office in Regent 105.

Your Registration Time Assignment

Registration time assignments for continuing students are based on class standing, including the number of hours completed at CU (any campus), transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of September 27).

Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random.

Note: Registration time assignments for new and readmitted students who are not required to register at an orientation session (see page 10) will begin on December 4, the first day new students may register.

Filling Out Your Confirmed-Registration Form

Use the schedule-planning worksheet on pages 126-129 to fill out a preliminary schedule for spring 1997. Then, fill out the confirmed-registration form on page 130 before calling CU Connect. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your confirmed-registration form in case courses you request are full.

Getting Academic Advising

If you are required to see an academic advisor (indicated on your invitation to register), call or visit your major department as soon as possible. Students with an undeclared or open-option major should make an appointment with the Advising

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

Resource Center, 492-8811. You are not allowed to register until you have met with your advisor and had your advising requirement cleared. Bring your completed confirmed-registration form to your appointment. (See page 11 for more information on advising.)

Calling CU Connect and Registering

Call CU Connect, (303) 938-8110, from any touch-tone phone to register. Use the function codes listed on the confirmed-registration form, as well as on page 129. You may call any time after your time assignment begins. Follow the instructions on the confirmed-registration form. After registering via CU Connect, list your classes by pressing 5# to verify your spring schedule.

CU Connect is normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight. It is also available on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (Exceptions: *Limited hours*—December 24, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; December 31, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; January 9, 1997, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; January 12, 10:00 a.m. to midnight.)

CU Connect is *not* available on Saturdays or on November 28, December 25, or January 1.

Adjusting Your Schedule

• *Make your changes before you return for classes in the spring!*

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule by calling CU Connect through the registration deadline, 8:00 p.m. on January 9. Follow the CU Connect function codes described and illustrated on the confirmed-registration form (page 130) to add or to drop courses from your schedule. After January 9, see pages 26-27 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

SEARCHING FOR OPEN COURSE SECTIONS

If you request a course section that has been canceled or is full, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a search for open sections of that course. If you do, press 7#. CU Connect will search for another section of the course that is available during the same time period. If one is available, you can register for that section. If one is not available, CU Connect will search for the first section of the course that is open and fits your schedule, until it is determined that no section of that course is currently open and available.

COURSE TIME CHANGES

• *Original course sections may be canceled and a new section added.*

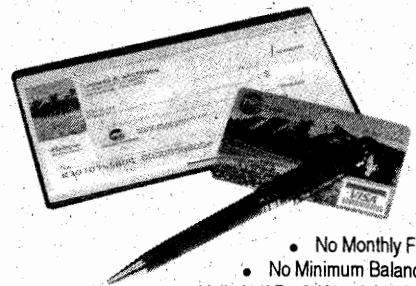
Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered *after* the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. When this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change.

If you register for a course and CU Connect tells you the course has been canceled, try the search option (7#) when prompted. CU Connect lets you know if the new section of the course with the time change is available and fits your schedule.

Listing Your Schedule

To list your schedule, call CU Connect and press 5# after you enter your PIN and when the computer asks for your first request. If you put your name on a course wait list, list your schedule frequently or look up the status of your wait-listed courses on the World Wide Web (see page 17) to find out if you have been enrolled in the course. If you are enrolled in a course you no longer want, drop it by the deadline.

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

Registering for Linked (Lecture/Recitation/Lab) Courses

WHICH COURSES ARE LINKED

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because *the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed*. Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers *are not listed* for the lecture and recitation; they are *only* listed for the lab.) See below for an example of how the linked sections appear.

Note: This does not apply to courses that have a required lab with a different course number, e.g., EPOB 1210, General Biology 1 and EPOB 1230, General Biology Lab 1.

REGISTERING FOR LINKED COURSES

To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically "links" all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all required sections of the course.

ENROLLMENT

If all sections of the linked course are open (lecture, recitation and/or lab), you will automatically be enrolled in all parts of the course. CU Connect will verify your enrollment.

WAIT LISTS

If one section of a linked course is closed, you have the option of searching for another section of the course (if another section is open or exists) or placing your name on the wait list, if a wait list exists for the course. If you are wait-listed for the recitation or a lab, you are then automatically wait-listed for all parts of the course (lecture, recitation, and/or lab). You

cannot be enrolled in the lecture and wait-listed for the recitation or lab.

Linked courses have resequenced wait lists (that is, wait lists that are based on a priority system to determine who enrolls in the course as spaces open up). Open spaces are determined by the recitation or lab you have selected. When an opening occurs in a recitation or lab, the student at the top of the wait list will automatically be enrolled in all parts of the course, but not until the end of that day's registration activity.

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in the course! It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. No verification of enrollment is sent.

DENIED ENROLLMENT

If you try to register for a linked course that is closed and has no wait list for the recitation or lab, or one part of the course conflicts in time with another course you are already enrolled in or wait-listed for, you will be denied enrollment in *all* parts of the course, even if there is an opening in the lecture.

DROPPING OR CHANGING A SECTION

To drop your lecture-recitation or lecture-lab or lecture-recitation-lab course, enter the recitation or lab course call number (whichever appears with a call number in the course listings). You will then be dropped from all parts of the linked course. *Wait for CU Connect to confirm that you have been dropped from the course.* If you need to drop one part of a linked course and add another, we advise you to make changes in an academic department or at the central drop/add site to ensure that you do not lose your space in a course.

WAIT LISTS

Throughout the confirmed registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it has been closed, you may put your name on a computerized wait list. The course may have openings later in the registration process. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used.

Automatic wait lists are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.

Resequenced wait lists use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. Press 9# when prompted and listen for verification.

Wait-Listed Courses

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course. Enrollment is determined by the total number of spaces and the demand for each particular course. Spaces may or may not become available at a future time.

It helps to have a list of alternate course choices if you are not enrolled in a course from the wait list. You may go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10 and 12-14), to Regent 1B60 (January 15-January 24), or use the World Wide Web (see page 17) to check lists of all available courses, open courses that meet core-curriculum requirements, and open courses by meeting time.

Note: Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit. (See page 13.) You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

Wait-List Positions and Enrollment

When you place your name on a wait list, the total number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions change during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods, it's a good idea to call CU Connect and list your schedule often to find out your position on the wait list. (See the instructions for listing your schedule on page 22.) If you are wait listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) is announced when you list your schedule. (**Exception:** On January 9, you cannot hear your wait-list position when you list your schedule via CU Connect.) Beginning January 10, you can also find out your wait-list position at any drop/add site. (See pages 26-27.) CU Connect does *not* tell you what "type" (automatic or resequenced) of wait list you are on.

Note: If you are wait listed for a linked course (lecture, recitation, and/or lab), wait-list positions are only announced for the lowest level of the course (the recitation or lab). See below for more information on wait lists for labs and recitations.

It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, drop the course as soon as possible by entering 3* on CU Connect, followed by the course call number and the # sign. Other students will be waiting to enroll in the course from the wait list. If you are enrolled in a course you no longer want and if you fail to drop the course by January 29 (4:00 p.m.), you are charged tuition for the course based on your number of credit hours. (**Note:** You need the instructor's signature to drop a course *after* January 24. See page 27 for more information.) Also, if you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an *F* for that course.

Deadlines for Wait Lists

You may place your name on course wait lists through **midnight, Tuesday, January 21.** At that time, all wait lists are frozen.

If you are on a wait list as of January 22 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. *There is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after January 21.* All department wait lists are canceled at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, January 24, the drop/add deadline.

Note: If you're on the wait list as of midnight on January 21, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you'll be eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered. See the "Course Reservation Program" information on page 12.

Wait Lists for Labs and Recitations

If a course with a required recitation and/or lab is closed (*i.e.*, a linked course), and a wait list is available, you can add your name to the wait list for the lower level of the course (recitation or lab), and you will automatically be wait listed for all parts of the course (lecture, recitation, and/or lab). If a space becomes available in the lowest level of the course, you will be automatically enrolled in all parts of the course. (See page 23 for more information on registering for linked courses.)

RECEIVING YOUR SCHEDULE

If you register by December 20, your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker will be mailed to your permanent address.

If you make significant changes to your schedule after you receive it in the mail and/or need another copy of your schedule or a replacement ID validation sticker, you can get a printout of your schedule and bill and a replacement ID validation sticker at the schedule/bill distribution sites listed below.

If you register after December 20, you may pick up your schedule/bill and have your ID validated at the schedule/bill distribution sites listed below.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5841 (TTY).

Validating Your ID

When you receive your ID validation sticker, affix it to the lower right-hand corner on the picture side of your CU-Boulder photo ID. Be sure the sticker does not cover your name and student number.

If you received a base-fees sticker and add more than one course, you will need a full-fees sticker. You may obtain the proper validation sticker (or a replacement sticker) at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10 and 12-14), Regent 1B60 (January 15-24), or in Regent 105 (after January 24).

Note: CU-Boulder photo IDs and ID validation stickers are not transferable. Any person who uses the CU-Boulder photo ID or ID validation sticker of another student or allows his or her ID to be used by another student may be subject to disciplinary action.

Sunday, January 12

The Coors Events/Conference Center will be open on Sunday, January 12, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. to provide the following services: drop/add, schedule/bill distribution, ID validation stickers, and late registration screening and set-up. In addition, a representative from the Bursar's Office will be available to answer questions about tuition and fee bills. Academic advisors from many of the colleges and schools will also be available.

Understanding Your Schedule

Your class schedule lists the courses for which you are registered. If a message instead of a course title is listed, or if a course you requested does not appear, you are not registered for that course.

Some reasons you may not have been enrolled in a course are listed below.

"STUDENT INELIGIBLE FOR COURSE"

- **Class Restriction.** Class enrollment may be limited by class level or to students who have earned a certain number of hours by the end of the previously completed semester. Class restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.
- **Controlled Enrollment.** Special authorization is required from the department before requesting the course. See the department for more information.
- **Major Restriction.** Enrollment is limited to students in specific majors, colleges, or schools. These restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.
- **Course Canceled.** Either the course or section you requested was canceled. Contact the department for additional information or try adding a different section or course.

You may use CU Connect to list your schedule and to make changes during the drop/add period (the first two weeks of the spring semester, January 10-24).

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5841 (TTY).

Drop/Add Time Assignments

Time assignments during the drop/add period are based on the last two digits of your student number. **You are not able to drop or add courses either through CU Connect or at a computer terminal until your time assignment begins.** Time assignments ensure that there is not too large a volume of students calling CU Connect or going to computer terminals at the same time. Time assignments are changed each semester to ensure fairness.

To change your schedule at a computer terminal (during the drop/add period of January 10-24), go to any of the drop/add sites listed below. ADJUSTING YOUR SCHEDULE

Changing Credit and Grading Status

In order to make any section change or a change of pass/fail, no credit, or variable-credit status over the phone or at an academic department, a course must be dropped and then immediately added. If you make these changes by phone or at an academic department, there is the possibility that you will *not* be able to add the course back once you have dropped it. It is best, therefore, to make these changes at the Coors Events/Conference Center (January 10 and 12-14) or in Regent 1B60 (January 15-24).

Adjusting Your Schedule by Phone

You may drop and add courses via CU Connect any time after your drop/add time assignment begins. To adjust your schedule by phone, follow the confirmed-registration instructions on pages 21-23.

Deadlines for Making Schedule Adjustments

DROP/ADD DEADLINE

The deadline to add courses and the deadline to drop courses without approval signatures for spring semester 1997 is 5:00 p.m., Friday, January 24.

January 24 is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on a course.

To add a course after January 24, you must contact your dean's office and have both your instructor's and your dean's approval on a special action form. No adds are permitted after January 24 unless there are extenuating circumstances.

To drop a course between January 24 and 29, you must get your instructor's signature on a special action form and turn it in to the registrar's office. **Note:** See this page for further information about dropping courses and the tuition-adjustment deadline.

TUITION-ADJUSTMENT DEADLINE ("LAST CHANCE")

The deadline to drop a course without being assessed tuition and fees for that course and without a *W* grade showing on your transcript is 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 29. **Note:** You must have the approval of your instructor on a special action form to drop a course *after* January 24.

No tuition adjustments are made for courses dropped after Wednesday, January 29 (5:00 p.m.) and you will receive a *W* grade on your transcript.

To drop a course between January 29 and February 26, you must be passing the course and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office.

DEADLINE TO DROP WITHOUT PETITIONING YOUR DEAN

Wednesday, February 26, (5:00 p.m.) is the deadline to drop a course with your instructor's approval only. After February 26, you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.) and you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.

Administrative Drops

Administrative drops are initiated by departments. If you have not met all the course requirements or do not attend your courses regularly during the first few weeks, you may be administratively dropped from any course. Check with departments for policies concerning administrative drops.

List Your Schedule Often!

List your schedule often via CU Connect to verify your enrollment and to find out your position on wait lists.

FINDING OUT YOUR POSITION ON A WAIT LIST

If you are on a wait list and you list your schedule via CU Connect, CU Connect tells you your specific position on the list. Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly.

Check your schedule often, using the list option (see page 22) to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you forget that you are on a wait list and are placed in a course and fail to drop it by January 29, you are charged for the course, and you will receive an *F*, even if you do not attend the class. **Note:** You may only drop a course via CU Connect through 5:00 p.m. on January 24 (the drop/add deadline). After January 24, your instructor's approval is required on a special action form to drop a course.

Verifying Your Schedule

List your schedule often to verify your courses and make any appropriate adjustments before the drop/add deadline (5:00 p.m. on January 24).

BURSAR'S OFFICE—TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees are due by Wednesday, January 22, at 5:00 p.m. There are penalties for nonpayment and for late payment (see page 36). *Postmarks are not honored.*

Financial aid, including Federal Direct Student Loans, affects your tuition and fee bill. See page 37 for up-to-date information.

Understanding Tuition Charges

- After January 29, there are no tuition or course-fee adjustments for courses dropped. However, tuition for courses added is assessed and billed.
- A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.
- Tuition for a no-credit course is the same as for a course taken for credit.
- Tuition for a 0-credit-hour course is charged at the rate of a 3-credit-hour course.

DESCRIPTION AND BREAKDOWN OF UCSU STUDENT FEES

Full Fees \$191.85

UCSU student fees are mandatory for students enrolled in more than one class or in one class of more than 5 credit hours and may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If your fees are waived, you must still pay the base fee of \$31.23. If you wish to petition for a waiver of UCSU fees, you must do so by 5:00 p.m. on January 22. No late petitions are accepted. Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, or the UCSU office in UMC 333, and must include documentation of

the reasons for waiving the fees. Note: Students covered by the University student health insurance cannot waive their full student fees. *A complete breakdown of this fee follows:*

Cultural Events Board (CEB) \$ 3.95

CEB is a student-run organization dedicated to promoting cultural awareness on the Boulder campus through a wide variety of cultural programming since 1974. CEB is approved by both the Administration and Board of Regents.

Environmental Board \$ 3.23

The Environmental Board is a student-run resource center encouraging environmental involvement of the campus community. It promotes alternative transportation, water and energy conservation, and responsible resource use by students, faculty, and staff. The Environmental Center was begun by students in 1970 after the first Earth Day. In 1976, CU Recycling was initiated, and the Environmental Center began receiving UCSU funding. CU Recycling began its new student-administrative partnership in 1992. It is the largest campus recycling operation in the U.S.

KUCB \$ 1.06

KUCB is the radio station serving campus and the surrounding Boulder community with 24 hours of news, weather, sports, and alternative music. It provides 100-150 volunteers with experience in radio, production, advertising, marketing, business, and management. It is student initiated and approved by both the Administration and Board of Regents.

Legal Services \$ 2.81

Legal Services provides direct legal services (*i.e.*, counseling, negotiation, document preparation and in-court representation) to fee-paying students. It is student supported and approved by both the Administration and Board of Regents. As mandated by the Board of Regents, 20% of Legal Services budget is self-generated.

Off Campus Student Services \$ 2.36

This service maintains listings of rooms, houses, and apartments for rent in the Boulder community, as well as lists of students looking for roommates. It offers advice about leases, security deposits, and how to avoid landlord/tenant problems. It is student supported and approved by the Administration and Board of Regents.

Police Recharges \$ 1.30

Provides payment to the CU Police Department for patrolling the UMC, Wardenburg Health Center, and the Recreation Center.

Recreation Center \$65.29

The Recreation Center meets group and individual recreational needs of the campus. It is jointly governed by UCSU and the Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs with Board of Regents approval.

Student Organizations Finance Office (SOFO) \$ 4.75

"Uncollectibles" include bad debt expenses.

University Memorial Center (UMC) \$33.37

Arts \$3.25*

This fee supports on-campus performing arts (theatre, dance, music, and fine arts) so that all students can have access to museums, performances, etc., by providing no-charge or reduced-cost admission. It is student supported and was mandated by Board of Regents in June 1995.

**(In 1999, when the College of Music referendum expires, it will automatically be added to the current arts fee, raising the fee to \$3.75 per student.)*

Athletic Fee \$28.50

This fee is charged *only* to students carrying credit hours of 4 or more. Students carrying *total* credit hours of 3 or less do not pay this fee. It supports women's and non-revenue sports such as skiing, tennis, women's basketball, and volleyball. This fee allows students to purchase season tickets for football and men's basketball at greatly reduced rates. (Students' season tickets for football are currently \$25, and \$15 for men's basketball. Students can attend women's basketball and volleyball at no charge.) This fee was originally mandated by Board of Regents in 1980, with current fee reduction mandated June 1993.

RTD Fee \$14.52

This fee allows students free use of public transportation (with an RTD bus pass) in Boulder County and to Broomfield, Westminster, and Denver. (**Exception:** \$8 one-way or \$13 round-trip to DIA.) Within the city of Denver, regular RTD fare will be charged. This fee also supports the Night Hop Shuttle (runs Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 10:30 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., connecting the Hill Area to downtown Boulder), and the Day Hop (runs 7 a.m - 7 p.m., Monday through Friday). *There is no charge for either service.* This fee was student initiated and approved by the Administration and Board of Regents in 1991.

Student Information System (SIS) \$ 6.00

This fee is for maintenance and upkeep of the four-campus student on-line computer systems. (Each campus of the four-campus system contributes to this support.) It was approved by the Administration and Board of Regents in 1984.

Student Computing \$15.00

This fee is charged to students taking credit hours of 7 or more (for credit hours of 6 or less, \$ 7.50). It is used for building, maintaining, expanding, and updating computing labs (currently 68 across campus) and providing all students with access to computing accounts including e-mail, the Internet, etc. The fee originated in 1990 and was supported by the students and the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs was approved by the Board of Regents.

Matriculation Fee \$35.00


This is a one-time, nonrefundable fee that is assessed at the time of initial registration for students entering a program and for new degree students. Nondegree students who are admitted to degree status are assessed the matriculation fee at the time of their first registration after they have become degree-seeking students.

Enrollment Deposit

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the University until you graduate or officially withdraw from the University within established dates and guidelines (see page 41 for the "Withdrawal Refund or Assessment Schedule"). At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar or the Bursar's Office before you graduate or withdraw to be sure you receive your refund. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

If you enroll at the University the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established University policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

Housing Security Deposit

Beginning fall semester 1996, all students who live in the residence halls are required to pay a one-time security deposit of \$200. This security deposit is held by the Department of Housing and is released to your tuition and fee account within 60 days after the expiration of your housing agreement.

Note: The security deposit required for housing is distinct and separate from the enrollment deposit required for admission to the University.

Residency

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for spring 1997 should turn in residency petitions by **4:00 p.m., December 27, 1996**, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, Campus Box 68, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through January 17, 1997, but students who submit petitions after December 27 may not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by November 1, 1996, receive a decision by the enrollment deposit refund deadline of December 31, 1996. Financial aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by November 1, 1996, to make sure their financial aid award is processed in time for spring semester.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state residency status is available from the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 1B54, or by calling (303) 492-6868.

Student Health

Insurance for Spring 1997

Students enrolled in the spring 1997 semester who were not enrolled in the fall 1996 semester will receive an insurance packet in the mail in the month of December. More information is available at (303) 492-5107.

All students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more are automatically assessed for Plan A of the student health insurance. If you do not wish to be insured through the University-sponsored plan, be sure to submit a selection/waiver form to Wardenburg Student Health Center (WSHC) by January 22, 1997. Students who submitted a form in fall 1996 need not submit a form in the spring unless they wish to change their option.

Plan A insurance provides up to 100-percent coverage for eligible medical costs incurred at Wardenburg Student Health Center. It also provides 75- to 100-percent coverage at other medical facilities, after a deductible is satisfied. (This is dependent upon the type of service rendered and the provider.) The plan provides up to \$250,000 in coverage per illness or injury on a world-wide basis. Benefits are provided all year round when both fall and spring semester coverage are purchased. There are also other insurance options from which to select.

If you are taking 5 or fewer credit hours (including graduate and undergraduate students), or you are enrolled in SAVE, Continuing Education, or the Time Out Program, the University-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first pay full UCSU student fees.

Exception: Approved doctoral candidates requesting student insurance are charged full price for the insurance, and UCSU student fees may be reduced. If you are taking 5 or fewer semester hours or you are in one of the programs listed above and you wish to enroll in the student health plan, you must sign up at WSHC within the enrollment period.

If you hold at least a 20% appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant, or as a graduate part-time instructor, you are eligible for a contribution toward student insurance. The University will contribute a portion of the cost toward either Option A or B.

If you do not wish to purchase University health insurance, complete a waiver to remove this charge from your bill. To be honored, waivers must be turned in to WSHC by January 22, 1997. A selection/waiver form need not be submitted in the spring 1997 semester if you submitted one in the fall 1996 semester, unless you wish to change the insurance option.

For more details on other insurance options or if you have questions, call the Student Insurance Office at (303) 492-5107.

BURSAR'S OFFICE—PAYING YOUR BILL

You may pay your bill by a personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado. If you decide to pay in cash, make your payment at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent. If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.*

The payment deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 22, 1997.

It is recommended that checks be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges may be assessed.

Note: All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the University.

Permanent drop boxes are located outside Regent Administrative Center at the north and south entrances. The boxes are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to make a payment on any bills owed to the Bursar's Office. Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for additional drop box locations.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 175, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

If you are using the U.S. Postal Service, mail your payment early. **The University must receive your payment by January 22. Postmark dates are not honored.** If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time.

Hours of Operation: The Bursar's Office hours from January 10-24 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

For your convenience, the Bursar's Office has evening hours on Tuesday, January 21. It is open 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for billing questions, tuition payment, refund-check distribution, deferred tuition, and short-term loans.

Special Assistance Available

The Bursar's Office offers personal assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with a disability. If you need assistance, stop by the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 150 or call (303) 492-5381, or if deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-3528 (TTY).

Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

If you foresee any problems in paying your bill in full by the January 22nd deadline, you can elect to defer up to one-half of

your balance due. By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on January 22. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is reduced automatically by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced. If there are changes, you can access your current bill information on PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>, or call (303) 492-5091 for your current balance.

On February 26, you must pay the balance of your bill, plus a one-percent finance charge and any charges added to your bill after your bill is produced. A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed to your local mailing address the first week of February. Make sure your address is current.

If you do not receive a schedule/bill in the mail, or if the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent.

Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

University policy requires that a financial stop be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline.

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management department for collection, where you must pay any assessed collection charges.

Colorado law requires the University to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services Office (CCS). If your account is referred to CCS, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge on the unpaid balance (one percent per month), is assessed according to the following schedule:

Personal Check Policy

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the University, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the University. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes. Specific inquiries concerning reporting of bad checks should

be directed to the Student Debt Management department in the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

Failure to Complete Financial Transactions/Financial Stops

If you fail to pay your bill, miss payment deadlines, or write delinquent checks to the University, you are subject to late fees, finance charges, and financial stops.

Financial stops prevent you from registering for any future terms, receiving a diploma, dropping or adding courses, or receiving an academic transcript of work at the University.

Direct Lending

All Federal Direct Stafford/Ford and PLUS loan proceeds are applied directly to your tuition and fee bill. If your financial aid pays your bill in full, and there is money remaining, you are entitled to a refund (see this page).

If you are not eligible for a refund or the amount of the refund does not cover additional expenses, *i.e.*, food and rent, you must plan accordingly.

Getting Your Refund

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. You can receive your refund either by check or by direct deposit.

DIRECT DEPOSIT

The Bursar's Office has developed *direct deposit* as a more convenient means of providing refunds to students. Direct deposit enables us to electronically transfer money to your bank account within 48 hours after a credit balance becomes effective on your tuition and fee account. For more information, or to sign up for this service, please call (303) 492-5381 or (303) 492-3528 (TTY), or stop by and fill out an application form.

If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit, or sign up by December 23, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of January 7, your spring 1997 refund will be deposited into your bank account on January 10. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account.

REFUND CHECKS

If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of January 7, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on January 9. Make sure your address is current. This refund cannot be picked up.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after January 7, a refund check is available at the cashiers window in Regent beginning January 10. You must have your photo ID with you. Checks not picked up will be mailed to your local mailing address on a monthly basis throughout the semester.

Tuition and Fee Information on the World Wide Web

Do you need to know how much you owe on your tuition and fee bill? Has your financial aid (including loan proceeds) been applied to your bill and is a refund check available to pick up? What is the due date of the next tuition and fee bill?

FINANCIAL AID

If you meet all of the qualifications to receive financial aid funds, your scholarship, grant, or loan proceeds are automatically applied to your bill. (Look up your bill in the Personal Look-Up Services section of CU-Boulder's World Wide Web home page.)

All loans borrowed under the Federal Direct Student Loan Program are credited to your University bill, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria to receive your financial aid.

If you accepted a fall/spring loan (including PLUS), the total of the loan is divided evenly between fall and spring semesters.

Federal Perkins Loans

If you are awarded and accept your Federal Perkins loan and sign your promissory note, the loan is applied to your bill. If you did not sign the promissory note, please come to the Office of Financial Aid to sign a duplicate.

Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans for students are available through the Office of Financial Aid during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least 18 years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (SAVE and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer who is either a faculty or staff member or a student at CU-Boulder. The maximum amount that you can borrow is \$500, and the loan must be paid back to the University within 30 days.

You may also seek a short-term loan from the University of Colorado Federal Credit Union. Criteria for that loan can be obtained directly from the Credit Union at (303) 443-4672.

Reasonable Academic Progress

In order to receive financial aid, you must maintain reasonable academic progress toward a degree. This policy is published in a fact sheet and is available at the Office of Financial Aid, Environmental Design, room 2.

Automated Phone System

You may call the financial aid office's automated phone system from a touch-tone phone to request services or receive financial aid or bill information (day or night). Have your student ID number and PIN ready. Call 492-5091, and press 1 and 1 again to access your financial aid file, or press 5 for student employment. To speak with a financial aid advisor, call between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. (9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., summer), Monday through Friday, and press 2.

Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0106, or call (303) 492-7322 for further information.

Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The University of Colorado at Boulder refund/repayment policy is based on the refund policy requirements stated in federal regulations (34 CFR 668.22). A refund or repayment may result if you withdraw from school. This refund does not mean giving money back to you; it means paying financial aid funds back to financial aid accounts if financial aid was used to pay any portion of your bill (direct loans, Federal Pell Grant, etc.). The Bursar's Office calculates your charges and determines if you received financial aid funds. If you did receive financial aid funds, the Office of Financial Aid is then notified. We calculate the amount of the refund due to the financial aid accounts.

The *Withdrawal Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees* states that students who pay their \$200 enrollment deposit and register for classes for any given semester are obligated to pay full tuition and fees for that semester, unless they *officially withdraw* from the University. If you withdraw before the first day of classes, all financial aid will be cancelled (Rebate A or B).

Tuition and fee obligations for withdrawing students are as follows:

- a. If you withdraw on or before the third Wednesday of instruction, the full amount of the enrollment deposit is retained by the University (Rebate B).
- b. After the third Wednesday of instruction through the fifth Wednesday of instruction, 40 percent of full tuition and mandatory fees is assessed (Rebate C).
- c. After the fifth Wednesday of instruction through the seventh Wednesday of instruction, 60 percent of full tuition and mandatory fees is charged (Rebate D).
- d. After the seventh Wednesday of instruction, 100 percent of full tuition and fees is due the University (Rebate E).

Financial aid funds will be used to pay all institutional charges. If you did not receive sufficient financial aid to cover the charges and repay the financial aid accounts, you will receive a bill.

There is an exception to the above for a first-time student. If you are a first-time student and you withdraw before 60 percent of the semester has passed, the financial aid office must calculate the "portion that remains" of the semester and assess the amount of financial aid to be repaid to the funds appropriately.

FINANCIAL AID

In the case of a prolonged illness, accident, death in the family, or other circumstances that make it impractical for you to complete the semester, the Bursar's Office will review the information you give and make a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the University.

REFUNDS

If you received financial aid other than work-study, and the calculation results in a refund, we refund financial aid accounts in the following order:

The amount refunded to any program cannot be greater than the amount awarded from that fund. Refunds are rounded upward to the nearest dollar. If a refund is made to a loan program, you or your parent will receive simultaneous notice of the refund. If you petition the Bursar's Office for a different rebate period, we will recalculate the refund to the financial aid accounts if your petition is granted. Examples of refund calculations are available upon request from the Office of Financial Aid.

REPAYMENT

The following repayment policy is applied if you received financial aid for educational costs other than tuition and fees and you withdraw. Federal Direct Loans and work-study awards are excluded from this calculation.

To determine if you received an overpayment, we must establish that the *funds you received* (the refund check after your aid paid your bill) for living expenses, travel, etc. (these are non-direct educational costs) exceeded the *costs* for your living expenses, etc., for the time you were enrolled.

If any portion of the refund you received cannot be attributed to the cost of books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and medical expenses, then that portion must be returned to the fund from which it was received. The Office of Financial Aid will return the amount calculated to the aid funds and then a bill will be created for you by the Bursar's Office. In the event that there is a balance due, your bill payments will be handled by the Bursar's Office.

OTHER REGISTRATION

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

Note: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 492-5841 (TTY).

Concurrent Registration

- Obtain forms in Regent 105 beginning December 30.

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the spring and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning December 30. For information, call (303) 492-5821.

Note to Graduate Students: Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

High School Nondegree Registration

The high school nondegree program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is held through the SAVE program. Please contact Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148.

Intercampus Registration

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus, you may be able to register directly on that campus. However, you must apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campuses except in the summer.)

Registration for Faculty and Staff

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 free credit hours each year. The academic year begins with the summer session, and the number of free credit hours is determined on a prorated basis from full-time employment status. Beginning January 12, enrollment is held on a space-available basis in conjunction with late registration.

If you wish to register early, you may register via CU Connect by January 9 (8:00 p.m.). However, full tuition and fees are charged if you register before January 12. (Follow all instructions and deadlines that apply to continuing students.)

If you take a course(s) as a nondegree student, you must take a copy of your current Personnel Action Form (PAF) and a nondegree student application to the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, by December 2, 1996. If you were enrolled on the Boulder campus during fall semester 1996, you are set up automatically for spring 1997. A current Personnel Action Form (PAF) is required each semester for which a waiver is needed.

You are assessed the student computing fee of \$7.50, the Student Information System fee of \$6.00, the \$3.25 arts fee, the \$14.52 RTD bus pass fee, and all applicable course fees. Refer to the "Course Fees" section on pages 33-34 for additional information.

You must take course work outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to your employing department. For more information, call (303) 492-4369 or 492-3563.

Senior Citizens Auditors Program Registration

All Colorado residents age 55 and older can register in this tuition-free, noncredit program to audit classes on a space-available basis. This program is sponsored by the CU-Boulder Alumni Association. Registration for senior auditors is at Koenig Alumni Center, January 21, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and January 22, 9:00 a.m. to noon. Call 492-8484 for information.

Space-Available (SAVE) Registration

Nondegree students may take Boulder campus courses on a space-available basis. Register at the Coors Events/Conference Center, January 14, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. After January 14, registration will be at the Continuing Education Office (1221 University). Tuition charges are identical to CU-Boulder rates, and payment is due in full upon enrollment.

OTHER REGISTRATION/WITHDRAWING

Note: Out-of-state students who want to register for 3 credit hours or less through SAVE are assessed a rate less than the regular out-of-state tuition rate. (Degree students must obtain approval from their dean, and out-of-state students registered for 4 hours or more through SAVE are assessed at the regular out-of-state tuition rate.)

When you register for the Boulder campus SAVE program, you pay Continuing Education for those courses. If you are a newly admitted degree student and have not confirmed your registration or completed a semester on the Boulder main campus, you must register as a nondegree student through SAVE. However, you will be required to reapply through the Office of Admissions when you want to return to the Boulder main campus as a degree student. For eligibility information, call Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148.

If you need to withdraw from spring semester 1997 *before* January 29, fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, CU-Boulder, Campus Box 7, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. You need not drop your courses; this is done for you.

If you withdraw *after* January 29, you must complete a withdrawal interview to discuss procedures for withdrawing and your reasons for leaving.

If you do not officially withdraw from the University by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses. **Remember:** Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.

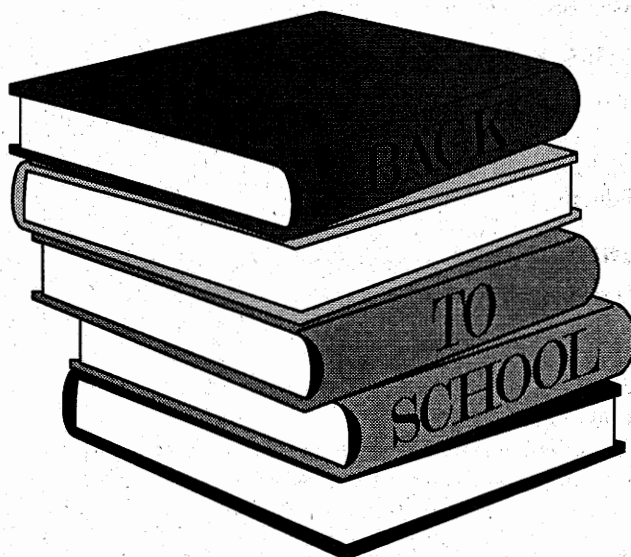
Note: If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see page 19) or reapply through the Office of Admissions.

Tuition assessments for students with financial aid may differ from those listed on this page, due to enactment of the Higher Education Amendments of 1992, Part G, Section 484B. Please check with the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the University. Failure to do so will result in a "stop" on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the University and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the University Student Loans department in the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

WITHDRAWAL REFUND OR ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE DATES

November 4- December 31	Full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit (continuing students only). Note: The December 31 deadline to withdraw and receive a deposit refund also applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program. New, readmitted, and transfer students are <i>not</i> eligible for a refund.
January 1- January 29	\$200 in tuition and fees is assessed. (The enrollment deposit is applied to this charge.)
January 30- February 12	40% of full tuition and fees is assessed, or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
February 13- February 26	60% of full tuition and fees is assessed, or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
February 27 and thereafter	No refund; 100% of tuition and fees due.

ABOUT THE COURSE LISTINGS

The course listings beginning on page 48 run the entire length of the two-page left column and continue on the entire length of the two-page right column.

Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

- 1000-2999 Lower-division courses (generally appropriate for freshmen and sophomores)
- 3000-4999 Upper-division courses (primarily for juniors and seniors)
- 5000-5999 Courses intended for graduate students, but may be open to qualified undergraduates under some circumstances (see individual faculty)
- 6000-8999 Courses open to graduate students only (see individual department offices for special provisions)

Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of course listings, in order from left to right, include:

Core Diamonds—A diamond (♦) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core-curriculum requirement. (Refer to the College of Business Degree Requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the College of Business core-curriculum requirements.)

Department—The department name, abbreviated to four letters.

Course Number—The four-digit number used to identify the course.

Credits—The number of credit hours offered for the course.

Course Title—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

Section Number—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P) or a studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses may have all three: lecture, lab, and recitation. See page 23 for instructions on registering for linked courses.

Call Number—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect.

Time/Days—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

Building/Room—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See the campus map for the building abbreviations.)

Instructor—The instructor's name, when available.

Maximum Enrollment—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

Remember: Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect will inform you with an appropriate message.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 124). You may *not* use courses taken to complete a MAPS deficiency to fulfill any area of the core curriculum, with the exception of foreign language.

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the *University of Colorado Catalog*.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 4, 5, and 6 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one requirement.

Skills Acquisition

1. Foreign Language

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you are required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination. Minimum Academic Preparation Standards

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

English	4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
Mathematics	3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
Natural Science	3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
Social Science	3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
Foreign Language	completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.
